WHEREAS, nine states have election codes that provide for candidates for elective office to be nominated by more than one party; and

WHEREAS, the eighth circuit court of appeals has struck down laws in five additional states that prohibited multiparty nominations; and

WHEREAS, multiparty nominations allow smaller parties to have a greater presence in elections than might otherwise be the case; and

WHEREAS, multiparty nominations allow major parties the

option of accepting nonmembers into their primary election process; and

WHEREAS, candidates who receive multiple party nominations may appear more than once on the ballot;
