A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING STUDIES OF THE GOVERNMENTAL TAKINGS ISSUE.

WHEREAS, rights inherent and in association with the ownership of private property are constitutionally protected by the fifth and fourteenth amendments to the United States constitution as well as by Article 2, Section 20 of the constitution of New Mexico, which reads: "[p]rivate property shall not be taken or damaged for public use without just compensation"; and

WHEREAS, the taking of private property has become a major issue in public policy; and

WHEREAS, government action in enacting and implementing regulations, intended to be in the public interest and in the public welfare, often may infringe on the rights of private property ownership by reducing the value, limiting the use of or

otherwise adversely impacting privately owned property of New
Mexico residents; and
WHEREAS, protection of private property ownership is in the

WHEREAS, protection of private property ownership is in the public interest and, being a responsibility of the government at all levels, should be considered in any enactment of regulations; and

WHEREAS, a sensitivity to regulations that result in an inadvertent negative impact upon private property where possible is a goal to be achieved by all agencies at all levels of government; and

WHEREAS, the costs of both time and financial investment for the average New Mexico citizen may effectively bar access to legal remedy for regulatory takings; and

WHEREAS, litigation against federal, state and municipal governments continues to increase and is creating fiscal hardships for those governmental units;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the governor be encouraged to proclaim a conference with all state, county and municipal regulatory agencies as well as environmental groups, property owner representatives, farm and ranch organizations, to generate a better understanding of the regulatory takings issue; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the conference recommend legislation to reduce damage to private property or to compensate for any damage caused by wild game; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico legislative council create an interim committee to study the governmental takings issue or assign this issue to an interim committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the governor and the New Mexico legislative counci 1.
