16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:				
17	Section 1. Section 15-1B-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996,				
18	Chapter 44, Section 1) is amended to read:				
19	"15-1B-1. SHORT TITLE[This act] Chapter 15, Article				
20	1B NMSA 1978 may be cited as the "Information and				
21	Communication Management Act"."				
22	Section 2. Section 15-1B-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996,				
23	Chapter 44, Section 5) is amended to read:				
24	"15-1B-5. CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICERDUTIESThe chief				
25	information officer shall:				

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A. provide leadership in and coordination of the
continued development of the existing information architecture
with the technical advisory committee, executive agencies and
other public entities as necessary;

- B. monitor national and international standards relating to information resources technologies, develop and publish policies, procedures and standards relating to information resources management by [state] executive agencies and ensure compliance with those policies, procedures and standards:
- C. ensure that prudent risk management practices preserve the integrity and security of information and communications systems and ensure timely resumption of operations following a disaster;
- D. facilitate, cooperate with and provide guidance to executive agencies in the preparation of annual information and communications systems management plans, which shall include information about planned information technology objectives and expenditures for the next fiscal year in the level of detail and format specified by the chief information officer:
- E. work with the technical advisory committee and executive agencies to develop agency plans that:
- $(1) \quad demonstrate \ that \ the \ \underline{executive} \ agency \ has$ $developed \ relevant, \ achievable, \ measurable \ objectives$

consistent with the <u>executive</u> agency's mission and existing statewide information and communications policies and goals, including the information architecture, or that departures from [<u>such</u>] <u>the</u> policies and goals are justified;

- (2) show effective and efficient use of available resources, including staff, funds and existing capital and time;
- (3) specifically identify communities of interest, within and outside the <u>executive</u> agency, with whom information and data should be shared to prevent duplication of effort; and
- (4) provide for security of data and disaster recovery in a manner consistent with the <u>executive</u> agency's needs and statewide policies;
- F. make recommendations to the department of finance and administration and the legislative finance committee for approval or disapproval of the collective executive agency recommendations and requests for expenditures for information [or] and communications [management] systems if requested [information] appropriations in any fiscal year exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000). The amount requested is to be determined by calculation of amounts to be expended for equipment, software, maintenance costs, agreements for services and other related costs of such systems;

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G. monitor [periodically] the performance of				
executive agencies in achieving the goals of their individual				
information and communications systems plans and in achieving				
compliance with the information architecture. A written				
report shall be sent to the head of the <u>executive</u> agency, <u>the</u>				
department of finance and administration and the legislative				
finance committee. The report shall:				

- (1) specify compliance with information architecture;
 - (2) specify compliance with approved plans;
- $(3) \quad specify \ solutions \ for \ improved \\ compliance; \ [\frac{and}{}]$
- (4) [be provided, along with] include executive agency comments and recommendations [to the legislative finance committee]; and
- (5) include the status of implementation of technical advisory committee recommendations;
- H. develop a schedule for ongoing monitoring of major system development projects and provide a copy to the department of finance and administration and the legislative finance committee. A written project report shall be sent to the head of the executive agency as specified in the schedule and to the department of finance and administration and the legislative finance committee. The report shall:
 - (1) specify compliance with information

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- **(2)** specify compliance with [audit gui del i nes;
- (3) provide recommendations for improved compliance; and
- (4) be provided, along with agency recommendations, to the legislative finance committee] the approved plan, including milestone achievement, cost containment, benefit realization and schedule adherence;
- (3) identify major technical, programmatic and management problems;
- (4) include management recommendations for improved compliance and problem resolution;
- (5) include agency comments and recommendations; and
- (6) specify the status of implementation of technical advisory committee recommendations;
- review all budget requests for appropriations Ι. for information and communications systems for all executive agencies for each fiscal year. The chief information officer shall designate the priority of each requested expenditure by assigning priorities based on the state strategic plan for information and communications systems management. priority listing and recommended funding level shall be provided to the department of finance and administration and . 120459. 1

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the legislative finance committee on or before November 15 preceding the next regular session of the legislature. executive agency shall also receive a copy of the priority The budget request for appropriations shall be prepared in cooperation with each executive agency; J. make written recommendations to the department of finance and administration and the legislative finance

committee for approval or disapproval of all information and communication systems-related budget adjustment requests and make recommendations to the department of finance and administration for purchases of tangible personal property of information and communications systems exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000) and purchases of information and communications systems services exceeding twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000);

[J.] K. appoint members of the technical advisory committee, call meetings of the committee and preside over the meetings, as provided in Section [7 of the Information and Communication Management Act; and 15-1B-7 NMSA 1978;

 $[\frac{\mathbf{K}}{\mathbf{L}}]$ L. develop the state strategic plan for information and communications systems management on a continual basis. The plan shall be submitted annually to the department of finance and administration and the legislative finance committee. Amendments to the plan shall be made in cooperation with executive agencies and the technical advisory

committee. The plan shall take into account the existing executive agency plans and the information architecture and assess the resources available, costs and benefits of provisions in the plan, including assessment of alternative courses of action, the risks involved, a summary of the state's current and projected use of information technology, a description of major changes in state policy and a brief description of each executive agency plan; and

M ensure that persons conducting independent
validation and verification and independent quality assurance
for information and communications systems development
projects report directly to the office on information and
communication management and provide the department of finance
and administration and legislative finance committee with
written project reports."

Section 3. Section 15-1B-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 44, Section 7) is amended to read:

"15-1B-7. TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE--CREATION--PURPOSE.--

A. The "technical advisory committee" is created. The committee shall consist of senior technical representatives from the judiciary, the legislature, executive agencies, local political subdivisions, public school systems, higher education, the business community, the national laboratories and the general public and shall be appointed by the chief

information officer.	Meetings shal	l be held [on] <u>at</u> the o	c al l
of the chief informat	ion officer,	but at least	quarterly.	

- B. The technical advisory committee shall

 [represent users of the information and communications systems

 affected by the information architecture and shall] provide

 advice to the chief information officer [as to their needs] on:
- (1) state strategic planning and information architecture;
- (2) information and communications systems
 plans of executive agencies; and
- (3) information and communications system projects of executive agencies."

Section 4. Section 15-1B-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 44, Section 11) is amended to read:

"15-1B-9. SUNSET--TERMINATION OF OFFICE ON [TECHNOLOGY]

INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION MANAGEMENT.--The office on information and communication management is terminated on July 1, [1998] 2002 pursuant to the Sunset Act. Effective July 1, [1998] 2002, the Information and Communication Management Act is repealed."

Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 1998.
