17	Section 1. Effective July 1, 1999, Section 22-8-18 NMSA			
18	1978 (being Laws 1974, Chapter 8, Section 8, as amended) is			
19	amended to read:			
20	"22-8-18. PROGRAM COST CALCULATIONLOCAL SCHOOL BOARD			
21	RESPONSI BI LI TY			
22	A. The total program units for the purpose of			
23	computing the program cost shall be calculated by multiplying			
24	the sum of the program units itemized as Paragraphs (1)			
25	through (4) [in] <u>of</u> this subsection by the <u>cost-of-living</u>			
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1	<u>index, multiplying that product by the</u> instruction staff				
2	training and experience index and adding the program units				
3	itemized as Paragraphs (5) through (8) [in] <u>of</u> this				
4	subsection. The itemized program units are as follows:				
5	(1) early childhood education;				
6	(2) basic education;				
7	(3) special education, adjusted by				
8	subtracting the units derived from membership in class D				
9	special education programs in private, nonsectarian, nonprofit				
10	training centers;				
11	(4) bilingual multicultural education;				
12	(5) size adjustment;

19	B. The total program cost calculated as prescribed				
20	in Subsection A of this section includes the cost of early				
21	childhood, special, bilingual multicultural and vocational				
22	education and other remedial or enrichment programs. It is				
23	the responsibility of the local school board to determine its				
24	priorities in terms of the needs of the community served by				
25	that board. Funds generated under the Public School Finance

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Act are discretionary to local school boards, provided that the special program needs as enumerated in this section are met."

Section 2. Effective July 1, 1999, a new section of the Public School Finance Act, Section 22-8-24.1 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

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"22-8-24.1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] COST-OF-LIVING INDEX.--

A. For the purpose of calculating the cost-ofliving index, the department shall establish and maintain a database of housing costs in each school district. The database shall be updated annually at the end of each fiscal year. After establishing and updating the database, the department shall calculate the average housing cost in each school district and the average housing cost in the state.

B. A school district with an average housing cost that is equal to or less than twenty percent above the statewide average shall have a cost-of-living index of 1.0.

C. A school district with an average housing cost that is greater than twenty percent but less than thirty percent above the statewide average housing cost shall have a cost-of-living index of 1.02.

D. A school district with an average housing cost that is thirty percent or more above the statewide average housing cost shall have a cost-of-living index of 1.04."

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Section 3. APPROPRIATION.--Fifty thousand dollars

		2	department of public education for expenditure in fiscal year
		3	1999 for the purpose of performing or contracting for the
		4	performance of a study to establish a database measuring
		5	housing costs in the state's eighty-nine school districts.
		6	Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
		7	fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.
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
