MAKING APPROPRIATIONS AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES FOR STATE GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

APPROPRIATION. -- Three hundred fifteen Section 1. thousand dollars (\$315,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council service for expenditure in fiscal year 1999 to establish a bureaucracy and accountability review staff and to pay salaries, employee benefits, travel, supplies and materials, contractual services, operating costs, other costs, capital outlay and out-of-state travel of the staff. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 2. APPROPRIATION. -- Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the general fund to

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the administrative office of the courts for expenditure in fiscal year 1999 to conduct a magistrate capital needs study. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 3. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred thousand dollars

Section 3. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the office of the lieutenant governor for expenditure in fiscal year 1999 to employ work force development monitors and to pay salaries, employee benefits, travel, supplies and materials, contractual services, operating costs, other costs, capital outlay and out-of-state travel of the staff. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

MAKING GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES FOR STATE GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS.--The following amounts are appropriated from the general fund or other funds as indicated for the purposes specified. Unless otherwise indicated, the appropriations may be expended in fiscal years 1998 and 1999. Unless otherwise indicated, unexpended or unencumbered balances of the appropriations remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the appropriate fund:

A. two hundred fifty-two thousand dollars (\$252,000) is appropriated from cash balances of the legislative council service to the legislative council service for expenditure in fiscal years 1999 and 2000 to upgrade the legislative information system. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall not revert;

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B. one hundred sixty-six thousand dollars
(\$166,000) is appropriated to the legislative finance
committee for three performance auditors for expenditure in
fiscal year 1999;

- sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) is C. appropriated to the local government division of the department of finance and administration for the village of Tularosa youth program,
- notwithstanding the provisions of the General D. Appropriation Act of 1998, the appropriation in that act of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) from the irrigation works construction fund to the administration division of the state engineer in the other costs category shall be used to construct, improve, repair and protect ditches, flumes and other works of the community ditch associations from floods only in Rio Arriba county;
- the unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriation to the commission on higher education in Laws 1997, Chapter 206, Section 2 shall not revert at the end of fiscal year 1998 but may be expended for the purposes of that section in fiscal year 1999; and
- F. pursuant to the Joint Powers Agreements Act, the department of public safety may enter into a joint powers agreement with the taxation and revenue department to transfer the necessary fiscal year 1999 appropriations and authorized positions so that the taxation and revenue department may perform its statutory duties relating to motor transportation.
 - Section 2. SUPPLEMENTAL AND DEFICIENCY APPROPRIATIONS. --

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The following amounts are appropriated from the general fund or other funds as indicated for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for the purposes specified. Disbursement of these amounts shall be subject to the following conditions: certification by the agency to the department of finance and administration and the legislative finance committee that no other funds are available in fiscal year 1998 for the purpose specified; and approval by the department of finance and administration and the legislative Any unexpended or unencumbered balances finance committee. remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the appropriate fund:

- one hundred ninety-three thousand eight hundred dollars (\$193,800) is appropriated to the supreme court for litigation costs;
- six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) is appropriated to the jury and witness fee fund;
- three hundred thirty-two thousand seven hundred dollars (\$332,700) is appropriated from the magistrate court warrant enforcement fund to the administrative office of the courts for the magistrate court warrant enforcement program;
- twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$28,000) is appropriated to the supreme court building commission for maintenance and repairs;
- thirty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$37,500) is appropriated to the third judicial district court to repay a board of finance division loan for water rights litigation;
 - F. five thousand four hundred dollars (\$5,400) is

appropriated to the fifth judicial district court for judge pro tempore services rendered in fiscal year 1997 in the <u>State v.</u> <u>Lewis</u> water adjudication suit;

- G. forty-five thousand four hundred dollars (\$45,400) is appropriated to the third judicial district attorney for employee liability insurance and bar association dues;
- H. twenty-three thousand one hundred dollars (\$23,100) is appropriated to the ninth judicial district attorney for litigation costs in the prosecution of a conflict case for the fifth judicial district attorney;
- I. eight thousand seven hundred dollars (\$8,700) is appropriated to the twelfth judicial district attorney for expert witness fees;
- J. eighty-eight thousand dollars (\$88,000) is appropriated to the attorney general for the guardianship services program;
- K. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) from the severance tax permanent fund and two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) from the land grant permanent funds are appropriated to the state investment council for bank custody fees;
- L. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated to the general services department for the required match of procurement assistance federal funds in fiscal years 1996, 1997 and 1998;
- M thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) is appropriated to the state treasurer for personal services and employee benefits;

- N. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated to the state corporation commission for costs associated with telecommunications rulemaking and rate setting;
- 0. two million one hundred thousand dollars (\$2,100,000) is appropriated to the human services department for the general assistance program;
- P. forty-nine thousand two hundred dollars (\$49,200) is appropriated to the department of military affairs for employee liability insurance;
- Q. three million seven hundred thousand dollars (\$3,700,000) is appropriated to the corrections department for costs associated with leasing bed space for women inmates under existing contracts; and
- R. one hundred thirty-one thousand nine hundred dollars (\$131,900) is appropriated to the New Mexico military institute for the Saunders barracks phase two construction project.
- Section 3. COMPUTER SYSTEMS ENHANCEMENT FUND APPROPRIATIONS. -- Eleven million three hundred seventy-seven thousand dollars (\$11,377,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the computer systems enhancement fund for allocations pursuant to the appropriations in Section 4 of this act.

Section 4. DATA PROCESSING APPROPRIATIONS.--The following amounts are appropriated from the computer systems enhancement fund or other funds as indicated for the purposes specified.

Unless otherwise indicated, the appropriations may be expended in fiscal years 1998 and 1999. Unless otherwise indicated, any unexpended or unencumbered balances remaining at the end of

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fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the computer systems enhancement fund or other funds as indicated. The department of finance and administration shall allocate amounts from the funds for the purposes specified upon receiving certification and supporting documentation from the requesting agency that identifies benefits that can be quantified and nonrecurring costs and recurring costs for the development and implementation of the proposed system and, for executive agencies, upon receiving certification from the chief information officer that identifies compliance with the information architecture and individual information and communications systems plans. If the funds are to continue a project, the documentation shall include certification that the project is on schedule, all funds previously allocated have been properly expended and additional funds are required. department of finance and administration shall provide a copy of the certification and all supporting documentation to the legislative finance committee:

- A. three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) is appropriated to the administrative office of the district attorneys for computer and network equipment and software;
- B. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated to the taxation and revenue department for personal computers;
- C. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated to the department of finance and administration for completion of the agency information management system core modules and user agency training;
 - D. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars

(\$125,000) is appropriated to the department of finance and administration for the procurement reengineering project module for the agency information management system;

- E. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated from information systems division fees to the general services department for mainframe software debugging tools, contingent upon state agencies funding these tools;
- F. three hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$370,000) is appropriated from the educational retirement fund to the educational retirement board for a year-2000 compliant server, software, hardware, data conversion and training;
- G. four hundred forty-five thousand dollars (\$445,000) is appropriated from cash balances to the public defender for computer equipment, software purchase and web page development;
- H. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the public employees retirement income fund to the public employees retirement association for an investment accounting system;
- I. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated to the state commission of public records for a server upgrade;
- J. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated to the secretary of state for the voter registration requirements definition;
- K. six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) is appropriated from cash balances in the regulation and licensing department to the regulation and licensing department for a year-2000 compliant boards and commission system;

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L. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) is appropriated to the office of cultural affairs for the New Mexico cultural resource information system;

M one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) is appropriated to the office of cultural affairs for a file server at the state library;

- N. fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) is appropriated from other revenue in the New Mexico livestock board to the New Mexico livestock board for one server, two workstations and database management software;
- 0. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated from the game protection fund to the department of game and fish for a client server and computer equipment for processing wildlife gaming license and citation information;
- P. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) is appropriated to the energy, minerals and natural resources department for upgrading to a year-2000 compliant financial system;
- Q. six hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$625,000) is appropriated to the state engineer for the water administration technical engineering resource system geographic information system component;
- R. seven hundred forty-six thousand dollars (\$746,000) is appropriated to the state engineer for the water administration technical engineering resource system;
- S. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated to the state engineer for geographic information systems;

- T. seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) is appropriated to the New Mexico public utility commission for year-2000 compliant hardware and software;
- U. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) is appropriated to the New Mexico public utility commission for personal computers in support of imaging requirements and the merger of the New Mexico public utility commission and the state corporation commission;
- V. three million dollars (\$3,000,000) is appropriated to the human services department for the child support enforcement system;
- W. five hundred forty-six thousand dollars (\$546,000) is appropriated from the employment security department fund and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) is appropriated from federal revenue to the labor department for contractual services to ensure mission critical systems are year-2000 compliant;
- X. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated to the department of health for an integrated public health information system;
- Y. one hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$130,000) is appropriated to the New Mexico health policy commission for developing data standards and design requirements;
- Z. eight hundred sixteen thousand dollars (\$816,000) is appropriated from the computer systems enhancement fund and eight hundred sixteen thousand dollars (\$816,000) is appropriated from cash balances in the children, youth and families department to the children, youth and families department for incorporation of the juvenile justice functionality into the family automated

AA. two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) is appropriated to the corrections department for procurement of a year-2000 compliant criminal information management system, financial management system modules, network hardware and software and related information systems costs and contractual services:

BB. nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000) is appropriated to the department of public safety for computeraided dispatch capability; and

CC. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated to the state department of public education for a year-2000 compliant comprehensive accountability system.

Section 5. ADDITIONAL FISCAL YEAR 1998 BUDGET ADJUSTMENT AUTHORITY. -- During fiscal year 1998, subject to review and approval by the department of finance and administration and the legislative finance committee, in addition to the budget adjustment authority granted in Laws 1997, Chapter 33, Section 10 and pursuant to Sections 6-3-23 through 6-3-25 NMSA 1978:

A. the seventh judicial district attorney may request that seven thousand seven hundred dollars (\$7,700) be transferred from the personal services category to the operating costs category for expert witness fees;

B. the eighth judicial district attorney may request that twenty-eight thousand two hundred dollars (\$28,200) be transferred from the personal services category to any other category to cover projected shortfalls;

C. the local government division of the department of

finance and administration may request that forty thousand seven hundred dollars (\$40,700) be transferred from the personal services category to the personal services category in the administrative services division of the department of finance and administration:

- D. the public defender department may request transfers from the personal services category to the contractual services category for contract attorney fees or to the operating costs category for expert witness fees;
- E. the New Mexico state fair may request transfers from the personal services category to the other costs category for retirement of debt:
- F. the New Mexico veterans center of the department of health may request transfers from the personal services category to the contractual services category;
- G. the southern New Mexico rehabilitation center of the department of health may request transfers from the personal services category to the contractual services category;
- H. the Fort Bayard medical center of the department of health may request transfers from the personal services category to the contractual services category;
- I. the public health division of the department of health may request transfers from the personal services category to the supplies and materials category or the other costs category to purchase HIV-AIDS medication;
- J. the long-term care and restorative services division of the department of health may request transfers from the personal services category to the contractual services

category in the medical fragile waiver to reduce the number of individuals on the waiting list;

K. the department of health may request that three hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$380,000) be transferred from the personal services category to other categories in the long-term care and restorative services division to settle payment for additional costs of treating outlier clients; seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) be transferred from the personal services category to other categories in the long-term care and restorative services division to resolve outstanding accounts receivable problems; and two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) be transferred from the personal services category to other categories in the long-term care and restorative services division to cover "Jackson" case legal fees;

L. the adult probation and parole division of the corrections department may request that three hundred sixteen thousand dollars (\$316,000) be transferred from the personal services category to other categories for additional costs associated with housing parole violators in county detention centers:

M the adult institutions division of the corrections department may request that one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) be transferred from the personal services category to other categories to cover projected deficits in the institutions; and

N. the corrections department may request transfers from the personal services category to the contractual services category for the operations of the New Mexico women's

correctional facility. The corrections department is specifically authorized to exceed the limit for payments to that facility provided in the General Appropriation Act of 1997.

Section 6. BUDGET ADJUSTMENT REQUESTS AUTHORIZED. --

A. As used in this section:

- (1) "budget category" means an item or an aggregation of related items that represents the object of an appropriation. Budget categories include personal services, employee benefits, travel, maintenance and repairs, supplies and materials, contractual services, operating costs, other costs, capital outlay, out-of-state travel and other financing uses;
- (2) "budget increase" means an approved increase in expenditures by an agency or division from a specific source;
- (3) "category transfer" means an approved transfer of funds from one budget category to another budget category, provided that a category transfer does not include a transfer of funds between divisions;
- (4) "division" means an organizational unit within an agency that is the recipient of an appropriation;
- (5) "division transfer" means an approved transfer of funds from one division of an agency to another division of that agency, provided that the annual cumulative effect of division transfers shall not increase or decrease the appropriation to any division by more than seven and one-half percent;
- (6) "program" means a set of activities undertaken in accordance with a plan of action and organized to

budget increases from other state funds to budget court-ordered responsible party prepayments, from the corrective action fund to pay claims and from the hazardous waste emergency fund to meet emergencies and may request transfers from the travel, maintenance and repairs, supplies and materials, contractual services, operating costs, other costs, capital outlay, out-of-state travel or other financing uses category to any other category;

- (84) the office of the natural resources trustee may request budget increases from other state funds for court settlements to restore natural resource damage in accordance with court orders and from internal service funds/interagency transfers and may request category transfers;
- (85) the New Mexico health policy commission may request category transfers;
- (86) the New Mexico veterans' service commission may request category transfers;
- (87) the children, youth and families department may request transfers from the travel, maintenance and repairs, supplies and materials, contractual services, operating costs, other costs, capital outlay, out-of-state travel or other financing uses category to any other category;
- (88) the department of military affairs may request transfers from the travel, supplies and materials, contractual services, other costs, capital outlay, out-of-state travel or other financing uses category to any other category;

Such budget increases shall be approved by the legislative finance committee only for emergencies and shall not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for each budget increase nor exceed a total of four million dollars (\$4,000,000) in fiscal year 1999.
