MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR A FEASIBILITY STUDY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION.--Three hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$320,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the local government division of the department of finance and administration for expenditure in fiscal year 1999 to undertake a feasibility study to plan or design flood control measures in the Coyote Canyon area in McKinley county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.
