A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THAT THE NEW MEXICO CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION

INITIATE LEGISLATION TO CHANGE THE WAY FEDERAL FUNDS FOR HEAD

START ARE DISTRIBUTED TO THE STATES.

WHEREAS, head start offers early childhood education and a wide range of other services to meet the health, nutritional and psychological needs of low-income children; and

WHEREAS, support for federally funded preschool, such as head start, is based on the assumption that preschool years present a special opportunity to affect later development, particularly among children from low-income homes; and

WHEREAS, early childhood education programs promote children's early development and improve their readiness to succeed in school; and

WHEREAS, research shows that continuity in early

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childhood programs and elementary school curricula supports children's early development and provides a smooth transition into elementary school; and

WHEREAS, early childhood education programs consistently demonstrate beneficial effects for children, such as improved academic achievement, a reduction in grade retention, earlier diagnosis of special needs and greater likelihood of high school graduation; and

WHEREAS, studies indicate that children who have participated in early childhood education programs demonstrate better classroom behavior, better social adjustment, increased pride in school achievement and increased commitment to school; and

WHEREAS, many parents and children do not have access to head start programs because they are not available in many areas; and

WHEREAS, if funding for head start were distributed to departments of education in all the states, head start would be school based; and

WHEREAS, if head start programs were school based, they would be available in all areas; and

WHEREAS, one of the goals of the national education goals 2000 is that "All children in America will start school ready to learn":

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE . 120280. 1

STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico congressional delegation be urged to initiate legislation to move federal funds for head start to the departments of education in all the states for distribution so that head start programs are school based to provide the highest quality childhood education, continuity in school curriculum and a smooth transition from early childhood programs to elementary school for children and their families; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be sent to the New Mexico congressional delegation. - 3 -
