15	WHEREAS, infrastructure is a vital link in the economic		
16	development master plan for New Mexico; and		
17	WHEREAS, the senate is committed to advancing the state's		
18	economic development prospects by improving the state's		
19	highway and transportation system; and		
20	WHEREAS, the state highway and transportation		
21	department's funds may be available in fiscal year 1999 to		
22	meet these needs; and		
23	WHEREAS, annual federal highway funding authorizations		
24	and reauthorizations result in hundreds of millions of dollars		
25	available to New Mexico for highway construction and		
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1 improvements; and

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WHEREAS, through various treaties and acts of congress, the federal government has promised Indian tribes certain goods and services, one of which is transportation services, to serve the social and economic needs of Indian tribes; and

WHEREAS, Indian tribes are totally dependent on the federal transportation programs for their transportation needs due to federal law denying Indian tribes eligibility to administer federal highway trust funds directly or to receive a portion of fuel tax revenue collected on Indian reservations for transportation purposes; and

WHEREAS, there is a critical need to improve transportation services on the Indian reservations throughout the United States to promote economic development, improve health care, enhance education and increase employment; and

WHEREAS, local governments must participate with at least ten percent of the costs of the projects enumerated within this memorial, and these projects are contingent upon local governments obtaining the required rights of way for the specified projects enumerated in this memorial and upon all projects being under contract by the end of fiscal year 1998; and

WHEREAS, the projects listed below are to be regarded with equal priority; and
