AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO PROVIDE CAREER EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION. --

- A. One million dollars (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the vocational education division of the state department of public education for expenditure in fiscal year 2000 to implement a career education opportunities system that prepares a qualified workforce to meet the needs of business and industry. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the general fund.
- B. Money from the appropriation in Subsection A of this section shall be used to:
- (1) implement or improve technical education programs that develop employability skills;
- (2) prepare students to achieve national skills standards leading to two-year degrees or certifications in chosen high-tech career fields;
- (3) upgrade or purchase equipment and materials meeting industry standards;
 - (4) implement performance-based

accountability reporting; and

- (5) meet maintenance of effort for the federal Carl Perkins Act.
- C. Funds shall be awarded to public high schools through a competitive application process based on criteria established by the vocational education division of the state department of public education.

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
