

Section 1. Section 30-22-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963,	
Chapter 303, Section 22-1, as amended) is amended to read:	
"30-22-1. RESISTING [EVADING] OR OBSTRUCTING AN OFFICER	RResisting
[evading] or obstructing an officer consists of:	
A. knowingly obstructing, resisting or opposing any officer of this	state or any
other duly authorized person serving or attempting to serve or execute any process of	or any rule
or order of any of the courts of this state or any other judicial writ or process; or	
[B. intentionally fleeing, attempting to evade or evading an officer	of this state
when the person committing the act of fleeing, attempting to evade or evasion has kn	nowledge
that the officer is attempting to apprehend or arrest him;	
C. willfully refusing to bring a vehicle to stop when given a visual	or audible

9	when the person committing the act of fleeing, attempting to evade or evasion has knowledge			
10	that the officer is attempting to apprehend or arrest him; or			
11	B. willfully refusing to bring a vehicle to a stop when given a visual or audible			
12	signal to stop, whether by hand, voice, emergency light, flashing light, siren or other signal, by a			
13	uniformed officer in an appropriately marked police vehicle.			
14	Whoever commits fleeing an officer is guilty of a fourth degree felony."

14	Section 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted to read:
15	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] AGGRAVATED FLEEING AN OFFICER
16	A. Aggravated fleeing an officer consists of a person willfully and recklessly
17	driving his vehicle in a manner that endangers the life of another person after being given a
18	visual or audible signal to stop, whether by hand, voice, emergency light, flashing light, siren or
19	other signal, by a uniformed officer in an appropriately marked police vehicle.
20	B. Whoever commits aggravated fleeing an officer is guilty of a fourth degree felony."
21	Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the provisions of this act is July
