AN ACT
RELATI NG TO GAM NG; CHANG NG PROVI SI ONS OF THE GAM NG CONTROL ACT TO EXCLUDE CERTAI N HORSE RACETRACKS FROM OBTAI NI NG GAM NG OPERATOR' S LI CENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGI SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 60-2E-26 NM5A 1978 (bei ng Laws 1997, Chapter 190, Section 28) is amended to read:
" 60-2E- 26. GAM NG OPERATOR LI CENSEES- - GENERAL PROVI SI ONS- - BUSI NESS PLAN- PLAYER AGE LI M T- - RESTRI CTI ONS. - -
A. An appl icant for licensure as a gaming operator shall submit with the application a plan for assisting in the prevention, education and treatment of compul sive gambling. The pl an shall include regul ar educational training sessions for empl oyees. Pl an approval is a condition of issuance of the license.
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B. An appl icant for licensure as a gaming operator shall submit with the application a proposed busi ness plan. The plan shal l include at least:
(1) a floor plan of the area to be used for gaming machi ne oper ations;
(2) an advertising and marketing plan;
(3) the proposed pl acement and number of gaming machi nes;
(4) a financial control plan;
(5) a security plan;
(6) a staffing pl an for gaming machi ne oper ations; and
(7) details of any proposed progressi ve syst ens.
C. A gaming oper at or licensee shall be granted a Iicense to operate a specific number of machines at a gaming establishment identified in the license application and shall be granted a license for each gaming machi ne.
D. A gaming oper at or licensee who desires to change the number of machi nes in operation at a gaming establ ishment shall apply to the board for an amendment to his I icense authorizing a change in the number of machines.
E. Gaming machi nes may be available for play onl y in an area restricted to persons twent y-one years of age or ol der.
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F. A gaming oper at or licensee shall erect a permant physical barrier to allow for multiple uses of the premises by persons of all ages. For purposes of this subsection, "permanent physical barrier" means a floor-toceiling wall separating the general areas fromthe restricted areas. The entrance to the area where gaming machi nes are located shall display a si gn that the premises are restricted to persons twenty-one years of age or ol der. Persons under the age of twent $y$-one shall not enter the area where gaming machi nes are located.
G. A gaming oper at or licensee shall not have aut omated teller machi nes in the area restricted pursuant to Subsection $F$ of $t$ his section.
H. A gaming operator licensee shall not provide, allow, contract or arrange to provide al cohol or food for no charge or at reduced prices as an incentive or enticement for patrons to game.
I. Only a racetrack licensed by the state racing commission or a nonprofit organization, except for a licensed racetrack located on state I and within the boundaries of a muni ci pal ity having a popul at ion of more than two hundred thousand, may apply for or be issued a gaming operator's license. No other persons are qualified to apply for or be issued a gaming oper ator's license pursuant to the Gaming Control Act."

Section 2. Section 60-2E-27 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1997, Chapter 190, Section 29) is amended to read:
"60-2E-27. GAM NG OPERATOR LI CENSEES- - SPECI AL CONDI TI ONS FOR RACETRACKS- - NUMBER OF GAM NG MACH NES- - DAYS AND HOURS OF OPERATI ONS. --
A. A racetrack licensed by the state racing commission pursuant to the Horse Racing Act to conduct live horse races or si mul cast races, except for a licensed racetrack located on state I and within the boundaries of a muni ci pal ity having a popul ation of more than two hundred thousand, nay be issued a gaming oper at or's license to operate gaming machi nes on its premises where live racing is conduct ed.
B. A racetrack's gaming oper at or's license shall aut omatically become void if:
(1) the racetrack no I onger hol ds an active Iicense to conduct pari-mituel wagering; or
(2) the racetrack fails to mai nt ai $n$ a mi nimm of three live race days a week with at least ni ne live races on each race day during its licensed race meet in the 1997 cal endar year and in the 1998 and subsequent cal endar years, four live race days a week with at least ni ne live races on each race day during its licensed race meet.
C. A gaming operator licensee that is a racetrack may have up to three hundred licensed gaming machi nes, but the . 125279. 1
number of gaming machi nes to be located on the licensee's premises shall be specified in the gaming oper at or's license.
D. Except as provi ded in Subsection $F$ of $t h i s$ section, gami ng machi nes on a racetrack gaming oper at or I i censee's premi ses may be played onl y on days when the racetrack is either conducting live horse races or si mul casting horse race meets. A gaming oper at or licensee that is a racetrack shall be permitted to conduct such games on onl y the af orementioned days for a daily period not to exceed twel ve hours at the di scretion of such licensee.
E. Al cohol ic bever ages shall not be sold, served, del i vered or consumed in the area restricted pursuant to Subsection $F$ of Section [ 28 of the Gaming Control Act-] 60-2E- 26 NMSA 1978.
F. A gaming oper at or licensee that is a racet rack located on state land within the boundaries of a mini ci pality with a population of more than two hundred thousand persons according to the 1990 decenni al census shall not operate gaming machi nes later than 10:00 p.m on any day of the year." - 5 -
