AN ACT
RELATI NG TO EDUCATI ON; PROVI DI NG FOR DUAL LANGUAGE I MMERSI ON PROGRAMS W THI N THE BI LI NGUAL I NSTRUCTI ON PROGRAM MAKI NG AN APPROPRI ATI ON.

BE I T ENACTED BY THE LEG SLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXI CO:
Section 1. Section 22-23-3 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1973, Chapter 285, Section 3) is amended to read:
" 22-23-3. PURPOSE. --
A. The purpose of the Bilingual Multicultural Education Act is to [insure] ensure equal education opportunities for students in New Mexico.
B. Cognitive and affective devel opment of the st udents in New Mexi co is encouraged by:
(1) [utilizing] using the cultural and Iingui stic backgrounds of the students in the curriculum . 125889. 1
(2) provi ding students with opportunities to expand thei $r$ concept ual and Iinguistic abilities and potential s in a successful and positive manner; [ and]
(3) teaching students to appreci ate the val ue and beauty of different I anguages and cultures; and
(4) promoting literacy and achi evement in two
| anguages."
Section 2. Section 22-23-6 NMSA 1978 (bei ng Laws 1973, Chapter 285, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:
" 22-23-6. BI LI NGUAL I NSTRUCTI ON PROGRAMS- - ELI GI BI LI TY FOR STATE FI NANCI AL SUPPORT. --
A. To be el igible for state financial support, each programshall:
(1) provi de for the educational needs of I ingui stically and culturally different students, including Native American children and other students who may wi sh to partici pate, in grades ki ndergarten through twel ve, with priority to be gi ven to programs in grades ki ndergarten through three, in any public school or any conbi nation of publ ic school s in a district;
(2) fund programs for culturally and I ingui stically different students in the state in grades ki ndergarten through three for whi ch there is an identifiable need to improve the I anguage capabilities of these students bef ore funding prograns at hi gher grade levels;
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(3) use two I anguages as medi uns of instruction for any part or all of the curricul um of the grade I evels within the program
(4) use teachers who have specialized in el ement ary or secondary education and who have recei ved special training in bilingual education conducted through the use of two I anguages; and
(5) emphasize the hi story and cultures associ ated with the students' mother tongue.
B. St udents partici pating in dual I anguage i mmersi on prograns approved by the department shall al so be eligible for state financial support.
[B.] C. Each program[mest] shall meet each requi rement of Subsection $A$ of $t$ his section and be approved by the department, the state superintendent or his represent ative to be eligible for state financial support.

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[ C. The provisions in Paragraph (1) of Subsection A of this section relating to grades seven through twel ve shall be phased in as follows:-
(1) grades seven and eight in the 1988-89
school year;
(2) grades ni ne and ten in the 1989-90-school
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year; and
(3) grades eleven and t wel ve in the 1990-91
school year.] "
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Section 3. APPROPRI ATI ON. -- Two hundred fifty thousand dollars $(\$ 250,000)$ is appropriated fromthe general fund to the state department of public education for expenditure in fiscal year 2000 to i mplement the dual I anguage immersion programs provided for in this act. Any unexpended or unencumbered bal ance remai ning at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the general fund.
