AN ACT

RELATING TO MUNICIPALITIES; PROVIDING FOR MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR INCORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 3-2-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1965, Chapter 300, Section 14-2-2, as amended) is amended to read:

"3-2-2. CHARACTERISTICS OF TERRITORY PROPOSED TO BE INCORPORATED AS A MUNICIPALITY. --

A. Any territory proposed to be incorporated as a municipality shall:

(1) not be within the boundary of another municipality;

(2) have a population density of not less than one person per acre, except for a class B county with net taxable value of property for property tax purposes in 1990 of

1 over ninety-five million dollars (\$95,000,000) and a
2 population of less than ten thousand according to the 1990
3 federal decennial census and where the population density of
4 the territory proposed to be incorporated is not less than one
5 person per four acres; [~~and~~]

6 (3) contain not less than one hundred fifty
7 persons; and

8 (4) contain a sufficient assessed value of
9 real property and a sufficient number of businesses so that
10 the proposed municipality will contain a sufficient tax base
11 to enable it to provide a clerk-treasurer, a police officer
12 and office space for the municipal government within one year
13 of incorporation.

14 B. In the alternative to the requirements of
15 Paragraph 2 of Subsection A of this section, any territory
16 proposed to be incorporated as a municipality shall:

17 (1) contain within its boundaries a resort
18 area having more than fifty thousand visitors a year; and

19 (2) have more than one hundred fifty single-
20 family residences, as shown by the property tax rolls. "
