[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLE.--This act may be 18 cited as the "Prescription Drug Affordability Board Act". 19 SECTION 2. [NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITIONS.--As used in the 20 Prescription Drug Affordability Board Act: "board" means the prescription drug 21 Α. affordability board; 22 "fund" means the prescription drug affordability Β. 23 board fund; 24 C. "manufacturer" means an entity that: 25 .223040.2

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1 engages in the manufacture of prescription (1) 2 drugs; or enters into a lease with another entity to 3 (2) market or distribute a prescription drug under its own name; 4 5 and sets or changes the wholesale acquisition 6 (3) 7 cost of the prescription drug it manufactures or markets; "pharmacy benefits manager" means an entity that 8 D. 9 provides pharmacy benefits management services; "prescription drug" means a drug that is 10 Ε. required by an applicable state or federal law or rule to be 11 12 dispensed pursuant to a prescription or is restricted to use by licensed practitioners; or that is required by federal law to 13 be labeled with any of the following statements prior to being 14 dispensed or delivered: 15 (1) "Caution: federal law prohibits 16 dispensing without prescription."; or 17 (2) "RX only."; and 18 "wholesale acquisition cost" means the 19 F. 20 manufacturer's list price for a prescription drug for wholesalers in the United States, not including other 21 discounts, rebates or reductions in price. 22 SECTION 3. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] PRESCRIPTION DRUG AFFORDABILITY 23 BOARD CREATED. --24 The "prescription drug affordability board" is Α. 25 .223040.2

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1 created and is administratively attached to the office of 2 superintendent of insurance. The board consists of five members appointed as 3 Β. follows: 4 one member appointed by the governor; 5 (1)(2) one member appointed by the president pro 6 7 tempore of the senate; (3) one member appointed by the minority floor 8 leader of the senate: 9 (4) one member appointed by the speaker of the 10 house of representatives; and 11 12 (5) one member appointed by the minority floor leader of the house of representatives. 13 The president pro tempore of the senate and the 14 С. speaker of the house of representatives shall each appoint an 15 alternate member to the board. 16 Members of the board are entitled to receive per 17 D. diem and mileage pursuant to the Per Diem and Mileage Act and 18 shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance. 19 20 Ε. Members of the board shall have expertise in health care economics, the pharmaceutical market or clinical 21 medicine. 22 F. A member of the board shall not be an employee 23 of, a board member of or a consultant to a manufacturer or 24 pharmacy benefits manager or their respective trade 25 .223040.2 - 3 -

G. To the extent practicable and consistent with
federal and state law, the membership of the board shall
reflect the racial, ethnic and gender demographics of the
state.

H. All initial appointments shall be made within
six months of the effective date of the Prescription Drug
Affordability Board Act. Members of the board shall serve
four-year terms. The terms of the initial members of the board
shall expire as follows:

(1) the members of the board appointed by the minority floor leader of the senate and the minority floor leader of the house of representatives, December 31, 2025;

(2) the members of the board appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives, December 31, 2026; and

(3) the member of the board appointed by the governor, December 31, 2027.

I. A member of the board may be removed from the board by a vote of at least three members of the board if a member of the board fails to disclose a conflict of interest or for other good cause.

J. If there is a vacancy on the board, a new member of the board shall be appointed by the authority that appointed the former member of the board to serve the remainder of the

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1 former member's term. The members of the board shall elect a chair and 2 К. a vice chair of the board. 3 The board shall approve an annual plan of 4 L. 5 operations. [NEW MATERIAL] CONFLICTS OF INTEREST.--The SECTION 4. 6 7 board shall adopt a model code of ethics pursuant to the State 8 Ethics Commission Act. 9 SECTION 5. [NEW MATERIAL] POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE 10 BOARD.--The board shall: develop strategies to lower the cost of 11 Α. 12 prescription drugs for stakeholders, including consumers, 13 health care providers, businesses and government; 14 Β. recommend regulatory approaches to the office of superintendent of insurance and the legislature for lowering 15 the cost of prescription drugs for stakeholders, including 16 17 consumers, health care providers, businesses and government; C. promulgate rules necessary for the 18 19 implementation of the Prescription Drug Affordability Board 20 Act; enter into contracts with qualified parties for 21 D. services necessary to conduct the powers and duties of the 22 23 board; Ε. examine the feasibility of contracting with a 24 25 pharmacy benefits manager to lower the cost of prescription .223040.2

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1 drugs for stakeholders, including consumers, health care 2 providers, businesses and government; F. perform education and outreach activities about 3 cost-saving initiatives for stakeholders, including consumers, 4 health care providers, businesses and government; and 5 G. conduct public hearings. 6 7 SECTION 6. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] REPORTING TO THE BOARD.--The 8 office of superintendent of insurance shall report all relevant 9 data to the board, including: A. total prescription drug rebates provided by 10 pharmacy benefits managers to consumers broken out by: 11 12 (1) health plan; and 13 therapeutic class of prescription drug; (2) 14 Β. the thirty highest-spend prescription drugs covered by each insurer; and 15 C. manufacturer-reported total financial assistance 16 to consumers for each of the thirty highest-spend prescription 17 18 drugs covered by each insurer. 19 SECTION 7. [NEW MATERIAL] ASSESSMENT .--20 The board shall be funded by an annual Α. 21 assessment on: manufacturers licensed pursuant to the 22 (1) 23 Pharmacy Act; (2) wholesale drug distributors licensed 24 25 pursuant to the Pharmacy Act; or .223040.2 - 6 -

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1 pharmacy benefits managers licensed (3) 2 pursuant to the Pharmacy Benefits Manager Regulation Act. The annual assessment per licensed manufacturer, 3 Β. wholesale drug distributor or pharmacy benefits manager shall 4 not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000). 5 The board shall deposit all money collected from C. 6 7 annual assessments into the fund. [NEW MATERIAL] PRESCRIPTION DRUG AFFORDABILITY 8 SECTION 8. 9 BOARD FUND CREATED .--The "prescription drug affordability board fund" 10 Α. is created in the state treasury. 11 12 Β. The fund consists of assessments paid to the 13 board pursuant to Section 7 of the Prescription Drug 14 Affordability Board Act, appropriations, income from investment of the fund and donations to the fund. This subsection shall 15 not be construed to prohibit the fund from receiving money from 16 any other source. 17 18 C. Money in the fund is appropriated to the board 19 to provide funding for the operations of the board and for the 20 purposes authorized pursuant to the Prescription Drug Affordability Board Act, including any costs expended by a 21 state agency to implement that act. 22 Expenditures from the fund shall be made on 23 D. warrant of the secretary of finance and administration pursuant 24 to vouchers signed by the chair of the board. 25

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1 Ε. Money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year 2 shall not revert to any other fund. The state treasurer shall hold the fund 3 F. separately, and the state treasurer shall account for the fund. 4 G. The fund shall be invested and reinvested in the 5 same manner as other state funds. 6 7 SECTION 9. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] LEGISLATIVE REPORTS.--8 On or before June 30, 2024, the board shall Α. 9 conduct a study of the state and national prescription drug market and recommend strategies for lowering the cost of 10 11 prescription drugs. 12 Β. On or before November 30 of each year, beginning 13 in 2024, the board shall submit to the legislative finance 14 committee and the legislative health and human services committee a report that includes: 15 price trends for prescription drug 16 (1) 17 products; and 18 (2) recommendations for legislation necessary 19 to lower the cost of prescription drugs for stakeholders, 20 including consumers, health care providers, businesses and government. 21 SECTION 10. APPROPRIATION.--Seven hundred fifty thousand 22 dollars (\$750,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the 23 prescription drug affordability board for expenditure in fiscal 24 25 year 2024 to establish the board and cover operational costs. .223040.2

	2	fiscal year 2024 shall revert to the general fund. The board
	3	shall reimburse the general fund for the full amount of the
	4	appropriation with assessments collected pursuant to Section 7
	5	of the Prescription Drug Affordability Board Act.
	6	SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
	7	provisions of this act is July 1, 2023.
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
