

In the 2019-2020 school year, ASK was only able to administer short cycle assessments in the fall and winter due to COVID-19 restrictions. These results indicate that by the middle of the school year, 38% of all scholars assessed gained one full year of growth in mathematics, while 48% of all scholars gained one full year of growth in reading.
