




2017-2018: 1,001,340 bus miles traveled






FMS serves 11,694 students. 85 % of FMS students attend an A or B School




Four-Year Graduation Rate 2015-2017

School Safety Key theme for the year

- Creation of Behavior Intervention Team
- Funding supported by NM State Legislature

Challenges
