

#### LESC REPORT

- New Mexico Highlands University's School of Education's Department of Special Education in conjunction with an approved NMPED partner, Albuquerque Public Schools has developed a, pilot fast track practice based Special Education Teacher Preparation Program. The program is entitled New Mexico Highlands University Prep (NMHUP). Reiterating, its intent is to expedite the preparation of non-traditional Special Education teachers on an <u>I</u> license by using a rigorous, practice-based approach.
- NMHUP Program initiated its services on 11/24/2014. However, our pilot students began in August at the beginning of the Fall 2014 semester at NMHU. These students were supported through personal funds or the NM Teach Grant.
- 3. NMHU PREP was funded by the New Mexico Public Education Department through the Public Policy Division.

The program was funded for Year 1 (2014/15) at \$ 377,589. There was a \$17,295.21 amendment to send faculty to a "Teach Like a Champion Workshop." The result of the amendment provided \$394,884.71. The Program was refunded for 2015/2016 at \$155,000. At the end of Year 2, the cumulative amount of funding equaled \$549,884.71. Currently, the Program has been refunded at \$435, 000 to support Cohort V and VI.

- 4. The Albuquerque Public Schools' Department of Special Education, under the direction of Dr. Anne Tafoya and Lucinda Sanchez, has been an excellent partner in this project. These Associate superintendents allowed select members of her staff to recruit prospective students who attended a 2014 Fall Job Fair.
- 5. The targeted students were individuals that qualified for a New Mexico Public Education Department "I License." (See attachment I.)
- 6. The prospective candidates completed an application that was reviewed by APS staff. (See Attachment II for Announcement and Application.)
- 7. Once an individual was accepted, they followed the flow chart related to next steps. Attachment IV shows the progression through the process.
- 8. Two Cohorts were developed during the 2014-15 Academic Year. Cohort I has a baccalaureate GPA that averaged 3.26 and their NMTA Basic Skills Scores and their NES Essential Skills Scores averaged 261. Their NES Special Education

Content Scores averaged 251. NMHU is awaiting test updates for COHORT III, IV, and V.

- 9. CORHORT III was supported by 2015-16 funding.
- 10. Attachment III will display our Certificate Program of Study.
- 11. At the completion of their Certificate Programs, COHORT I and Cohort II also completed their Master of Arts in Special Education from New Mexico Highlands University.

The strengths of the program strengths/improvements needed for the program.

- Passionate faculty.
- Motivated students

Improvements can be related to logistics. The successes can be related to the number of people receiving the Certificates in Special Education. There are always going to be individuals that dropout because of family circumstances or they just realized that teaching is a demanding profession and not for them. Fortunately, we only have had four individuals dropout. Their issues were related to a divorce, having to take care of a terminally ill parent, or teaching is not for them.

- 12. COHORT II complete their licensure requirements in December 2015 and completed their Master of Arts Degree by the end of the summer 2016.
- 13. COHORT III completed their licensure requirements at the end of Spring 2016 Semester. Their MA Degree in Special Education will be completed at the end of the Fall, 2016 Semester.
- 14. Additionally, COHORT I, COHORT II, and Cohort III attended the Southwest International Dyslexia Association Conference that was held in Albuquerque. In April (2015), five APS faculty and five Highlands faculty participated in the UnCommon Schools Conference facilitated by Doug Lemov that focused on Strategies and Techniques related to <u>Teach Like a Champion</u>. This coming year Cohorts IV and V will also attend the Dyslexia Conference. Additionally, we supported NMHU educational facuty to participate in how to change its program to emulate our NMHU Pilot Program.
- 15. The class, Introduction to Education, at New Mexico Highlands University is

being revised through the course The Craft of Teaching.

16. This opportunity provided by the Legislature through the New Public Education Department will impact the way we teach and were taught in New Mexico.

#### ATTACHMENT I

#### INTERNSHIP LICENSES

An internship license is issued for 3 years based on proof of acceptance into an approved teacher preparation program. All course work and testing requirements must be met by the expiration of the license. The internship license is a non-renewable license and meets the "highly qualified" definition of NCLB. The alternative licensure candidate may be permitted to assume the functions of a teacher while pursuing an alternative route to licensure. An Internship License is issued if one of the following three conditions are met: Approved Program Option - A Letter of Acceptance into an approved program is received with the application.

#### POST-BACCALAUREATE AND MASTERS PROGRAMS

Completing any post-baccalaureate teacher preparation program or advanced degree program with a teacher preparation program component within 3 years is considered to be an alternative licensure pathway.

#### INTERNSHIP LICENSURE FAQS

#### How can I qualify for an internship license?

With your application and fee, you need to provide our office proof of acceptance into an approved teacher education program or proof of eligibility to complete the Online Portfolio Alternative Licensure (OPAL) process or a letter explaining what you intend to do (already have a license, getting another, i.e. pre-k12).

#### Is the internship license renewable?

No. All requirements (course work and testing) must be met by the expiration date of the 3 year license. There are absolutely no extensions on internship licenses!

## Can experience earned during the life of the internship license count toward advancement in the three-tiered system?

No. Internship experience cannot count toward standard licensure.

#### If I receive an internship license in one area, can I switch to another?

You can switch; however, you will only have 3 years in which to meet all requirements for either of the licenses.

#### Do I need to teach for all 3 years of the intern license?

No. However, if you are pursuing Online Portfolio Alternative Licensure (OPAL), you must teach for at least 1 year as the teacher of record before submitting the portfolio.

#### What if I complete all of the requirements in 1 year?

You need only to submit official transcripts showing completion of the course work and a letter of completion if you are doing an approved alternative program. Exam scores should be on file.

### ATTACHMENT II

## New Mexico Highlands University Prep (NMHUP) Earn a Special Education License for Free

New Mexico Highlands University and its School of Education's Department of Special Education is partnering with the Albuquerque Public Schools in a project awarded by the New Mexico Public Education Department. The *purpose* of this grant is to expedite the preparation of non-traditional Special Education teachers for the classroom. The intention is to enroll and support twenty-five (25) candidates (with tuition, fees, and books) in a fast-track program (one-year) that leads to full certification as a Special Education teacher. To accomplish this goal, the partner- ship has established the following objectives: 1.) To prepare teachers for classroom instruction using a practice-based model; 2.) To have its candidates meet all New Mexico Special Education Teacher Licensure requirements, and 3.) To provide support and mentoring for at least two years after licensure is attained.

#### A. To be considered for entry to NMHUP, the students will:

- 1. Hold at least a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited institution;
- 2. Have a least a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale during their baccalaureate course of study;
- 3. Take and pass the NMTA Basic Skills test with a minimum score of 240. In the winter of 2015, the recognized cut score of 220 for the National Evaluation Series will be implemented;
- 4. Have a background check and Internship Certificate on file with NMPED;
- 5. Agree to attend and participate in all required courses, orientations, institutes, and field experiences;
- 6. Show progress toward completion of the Program of Study, and
- 7. Must agree to pay back any financial help if courses are dropped, completion of the program is delayed beyond the year identified for successful licensure, or is not employed in teaching after licensure.

#### A. Program Structure:

- 1. Teacher candidates will follow a fast-track schedule that will include online as well as on-site courses;
- 2. Intersession courses and condensed courses will be required;
- 3. On-site training and support will be provided, and
- 4. Coursework and field practica will be supervised on-site.
