

### NMCA Offers Socialization Opportunities


- Students are provided a variety of experiences for hands-on learning with their teachers and peers throughout the state.

- NMCA students make lasting friendships with their classmates despite geographical separation.






## 34 students at NMCA receive Assistive Technology Supports:













#### NMCA 16-17 Enrolled Households through 9.7.16
