- 3- What are they taking?
  - a. See attached documents outlining course names, credits, and institutions.
- 4- How are they doing after leaving Hobbs High School?
  - a. According to clearinghouse reports via NMJC – Hobbs High has consistently sent around 60% of our students to college following graduation.
    - i. 66-69 % of those students went on to attend NMJC.
    - ii. 5% of those students went on to attend New Mexico State.
    - iii. 5% of those students went on to attend ENMU.
    - iv. 3.5 % of those students went on to attend UNM.
    - v. 2% of those students went on to attend USW.
  - b. Dual Credit students – according to NMJC clearinghouse reports, from 2013 – 2015, of the 1008 students who took dual credit courses at HHS, 93% went on to college.
- 5- How do we advertise/market our Dual Credit Programs?
  - a. During Registration, our counselors promote the dual credit classes.
  - b. During College and Career days, we make a point to market our Dual Credit classes to our students.
  - c. College and Career Readiness Counselor – 15-16 (created informational material such as the course menu, online descriptions, etc.... for our students and parents)

6- Who's teaching the courses? How does this work?

- a. Course at NMJC – these courses are taught by NMJC faculty on site
- b. Courses at HHS – our current teachers teach these course on the HHS campus.
  - i. Licensure – our staff must be licensed/vetted by NMJC to teach the courses.
    1. Core/transferrable classes – 18hrs over bachelors in field
    2. Elective – MA requirements
  - ii. Issues – many of our HHS staff was vetted with MA requirements. They are teaching on a waiver as they pursue the necessary 18 hours above bachelors in the field. In 2017, teachers must be compliant.
    1. Teachers are taking courses to continue education.
    2. HMS is reimbursing teachers by course to pursue this continuing education (100k budgeted annually)

7- How do the textbooks work?

- a. ECHS – NMJC distributes new textbooks, HHS collects and returns textbook through its book depository.
- b. HHS Dual Credit – We utilize the college level books that are used for AP in each content area. Those books are distributed through HHS book depository.
- c. Finances – HHS pays for the books for ECHS and Dual Credit offered at HHS.

8- Positive Practices-

- a. Aligned Goals
  - i. College Success – Our Dual Credit courses are taught in conjunction with our AP courses. Curriculum meetings are held with NMJC professors to ensure validity and rigor. All students take an AP course at the end of the course.
  - ii. Honor Graduation – as of 2016-2017 school year, all dual credit courses are eligible courses for our current Honor Graduation Requirements.
- b. Aligned Resources (Thank you for passing the Perkins Reassurance 😊)
  - i. Perkins and Workforce Readiness Grant – Courses were created at HHS that meet dual credit requirements as well as certifications.
  - ii. Example – Hobbs High School Students received over 356 certifications in courses that were also dual credit. (Horticulture, Culinary Arts, Vet Science, Welding, Power Lines, Alternative Energy, Food Production) *Even if the students did not go to college, they still left with a certification to help them in the workforce.*

9- How do we make Dual Credit better?

- a. Entity Relationship and Communication – this has been the key to our successes.
- b. Funding for full time ECHS/Dual Credit counselor/dean.
- c. Site Specific – allow AP and Dual credit to be coded the same in STARS

## ONLINE COURSES

Registration for all online courses must be approved by school officials. eAGLE Academy courses will be monitored by school personnel in a computer lab. All online courses taken in these settings will be eligible for the same privileges as other Hobbs High School courses. AP online courses taken outside of a school setting will not be eligible for bonus points but will count toward the AP incentive program requirements. Students will be required to take the AP exams for any AP online courses taken.
