DDPC's Stance on the State of Special Education in New Mexico:

- System is fundamentally broken
- Pandemic exposed and exacerbates existing problems
- System must be rebuilt from the ground up
- Now is the time to build the special education system New Mexico's students need

Davis Family Special Education Experience

- Burdensome & adversarial
- Delays & administrative obstacles
- Haphazard implementation
- Lack of accountability
- Teachers & staff afraid to advocate
- Fear of retaliation

Special Education Needs

- More in-person learning opportunities
- Training focused on specific disabilities (e.g., ASD training) for staff and families
- Respite care & childcare

- If pandemic conditions worsen, and in-person or hybrid models are no longer options, alternative placement and in-home support will be needed
- Transition training/planning& Project SEARCH
