
Teacher Residency in New Mexico

What is a Teacher Residency?

Residencies provide teacher candidates with a \$35,000 one-year stipend while simultaneously being enrolled in wrap-around course work at a partnering college/university and being placed in a fully immersive year-long clinically-rich experience at a partnering school district with a mentor (level II or III teacher).


Residencies occur in partner districts that intend to employ the resident for

three years post-residency
