CLOSING THE OPPORTUNITY GAP

Although students in New Mexico demonstrate about a year'sworth of academic growth each year, not all NM students begin the school year at the same place.



By the time they reach 6th grade, low-income students will have received 6,000 fewer hours of learning experiences, including summer enrichment activities and afterschool programs, than their more affluent peers.

This opportunity gap means that, despite making progress every year, low-income students struggle to close the achievement gap.

IMPROVING OUTCOMES FOR LOW-INCOME STUDENTS

During the 2017-18 SY, students who participated in K-5 Plus before entering kindergarten were more likely to be at grade level than students who did not participate in extended learning opportunities.

The benefits of K-5 Plus are even more pronounced for low-income students, 24% of whom scored proficient or better after participating in K-5 Plus, compared with 12% of low-income students who did not participate.



K-5 Plus 2019-2020 Program Participation






K-5 Plus 2020-2021 Initial Applications



INCREASING ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

K-5 Plus and Extended Learning Time (ELT) programs address the opportunity gap by providing additional days of learning for New Mexico students.

An increase in instruction time has been proven to increase academic achievement. According to the Legislative Finance Committee, students in K-5 Plus programs have shown better performance than peers who didn't participate.

MORE ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

More instructional time also allows for enrichment activities and afterschool programs, as well as the flexibility to schedule professional development and collaboration time for teachers.

When paired, K-5 Plus and Extended Learning time can provide up to 200 additional hours, or 35 days, of learning time every year.

Teacher Salary Increases with K-5 Plus

Tier I 40k + 14% = 45.6k

Tier II \$50k + 14% = \$57k

Tier III 60k + 14% = \$68.4k

POSITIVE LOCAL ECONOMIC IMPACT

These programs also result in increased teacher salaries and have strong economic impacts on communities. Extending the school year to 205 days in a district with 8,000 students could mean 14% more pay for teachers, which translates to approximately \$15M added to the local economy.
