HISTORY OF NMSA



- Recognition of Need for Arts Education
 - NMSA Began with a Grass Roots Effort of Educators and Community Leaders
- New Mexico is a State of the Arts
 - NM should have a premier public statewide school for the arts

NMSA IS UNLIKE A CHARTER OR TRADITIONAL SCHOOL



NMSA receives the same public school operational support for its program as other New Mexico public schools. However, NMSA's balance of art training, residential dormitory, and community engagement programs require significant additional funding as they are, for the most part, not covered through the state's funding formula (the state equalization guarantee or SEG).

LEGISLATION



NMSA was created through legislation.

2008: New Mexico School for the Arts Act Passed Chapter 22 Article 15F NMSA Act

The purpose of the New Mexico School for the Arts Act is to provide for the establishment of the "New Mexico school for the arts" as a public statewide residential charter high school that provides New Mexico students who have demonstrated artistic abilities and potential with the educational opportunity to pursue a career in the arts.

NMSA & NMSA-Art Institute



NMSA Public School and NMSA-Art Institute work together to provide a rigorous academic and mastery arts high school education for students with passion and promise in the arts, leading to post secondary learning, careers in the arts, and lives that contribute to society.

Art Institute raised \$30M to build the current campus and raises funds annually to cover the costs of the outreach, residential, and balance of the arts programs.




NMSA ACT 22-15F-6-D

DORM PROGRAM



Currently, 30 students reside in a dorm program located at the Modern Elder Academy, formerly the Immaculate Heart of Mary Retreat Center.

Residential Directory and Residential Assistants oversee the daily program.

Students hail from Arroyo Seco, Carson, Espanola, Las Cruces, Las Vegas, New Laguna, Ranchos de Taos, Roswell, Silver City, Socorro, and Taos.

Students attend NMSA from across the state

 With the opening of the new dorm that will house 60 students, and with a 7-day-a-week program, more students from farther away can attend, allowing us to fulfill our statutory mission.

INTERIM COMMITTEE: 2020 HM 42



PURPOSE

In 2020, the New Mexico House of Representatives passed House Memorial 42 to recognize to recognize New Mexico School for the Arts (NMSA) for its excellence in arts and academics for students statewide, and to convene a task force to report on the school's accomplishments and *plans for continued success and sustainability*.

TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATIONS



- 1. Provide Capital Outlay funds to enable NMSA to plan, design, construct, equip, and furnish residential housing for sixty students. DONE.
- 2. Provide Extended Learning Time Program funding through the Public Education Department to NMSA and other schools with extended school days.
- 3. Support the proposed charter school facilities bill and base lease assistance payments on the number of students rather than on square footage. DONE.
- 4. Expand the Fine Arts Education Act to middle schools and high schools to enable more schools to offer arts programming.
- 5. Revise the state statute to designate NMSA as a new category of statewide school district; simultaneously, through statutory change, revise the SEG to increase the multiplier for NMSA students to generate additional operating revenue.

CASE FOR PUBLIC SUPPORT for operational funding of a 7-day-week residential program for 60 students.

- #1 5-day-a-week program excludes students from areas farthest from Santa Fe. A weekly commute is an impossible task for most families.
- #2. NMSA is legislatively created as a public residential statewide arts high school, and includes the requirement, as much as possible, to have equal representation from all three congressional districts.
- #3 The Interim Task Force addressed the both the need for a dormitory and the need for additional state operational funding.
- #4 NM Legislature provided \$8.3M to build the dorm on the campus. Now we need to a sustainable revenue source to operate the dorm.
- #5 NMSA ACT requires we provide housing for students from around the state who live too far away to attend school and have access and opportunity to this mastery art and academic education.

2023 LEGISLATION: Proposed Dorm Public Funding



We are working on identifying various funding sources, projecting expenses, and drafting a bill for the 2023 session.

We are looking to create a non-reverting permanent fund in the state treasury to support a 7-day-a-week dormitory program to allow students from around the state to attend NMSA and access it's arts and academic programs.
