Special Appropriation to the NMISC

STATE ENGINEER \$17,000,000

For the interstate stream compact compliance and water development program to develop and fund a water management pilot project for the Lower Rio Grande for fiscal years 2020 through 2023. No more than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from this appropriation may be expended for startup costs in fiscal years 2020 and 2021 and no more than five million dollars (\$5,000,000) from this appropriation may be expended in each fiscal year from fiscal years 2021 through 2023. Local entities shall be responsible for cost-share contributions beginning in fiscal year 2021*

*This amount was reduced during the First Special Session of the 54th Legislature by \$10 million (to \$7 million)



Intent of Pilot Program

Short-term (Though FY 2021)

- Determine the resources needed to plan, implement, administer, and verify results
- Establish a test process for fallowing irrigated lands
 - Legal
 - Technical
 - Economic
 - Outreach

Long-term (Current and Beyond FY 2021)

- Research, develop and test tools for managing water (governance and operations) in the Lower Rio Grande
 - Work to establish an entity to manage a long-term Program
- Develop comprehensive economic and market information
- Develop hydrological studies to evaluate management actions including
 - Reduction of water consumption
 - Aquifer respondence
 - Improvement to surface water delivery efficiency



Initial Implementation

- The SE and the Director met with staff to initiate the background work necessary to implement the Program
- □ The background work included
 - Standing up an internal working group and sub groups to begin scoping the Program
 - Sub groups continue to assess and report back to internal working group
 - Internal
 - Legal
 - Agriculture/OSE District 4 communications
 - External
 - Initial meetings were held with the farming community representatives to assess first steps on a rotational fallowing program
 - Hydrology working group

Work Plan details

- □ \$2,000,000 start-up budget
 - 3 FTE staff \$300,000
 - Contractual services \$1,675,000
- Conservation grant agreements developed for 2021 growing season
- Hiring freeze implications on staffing
 - New Coordinator position was filled as of 05-17-21

Work Elements

- □ **Element 1** Determine the resources needed to plan, implement, administer, and verify results of various water management actions
 - **\$400,000**
- □ **Element 2** Develop economic and market information
 - **\$200,000**
- □ **Element 3** Establish a test process for voluntary fallowing of irrigated lands
 - **\$300,000**
- Element 4 Develop hydrological studies to evaluate how effectively different water management actions promote aquifer health and improve surface water deliveries
 - **5500,000**
- □ **Element 5** Explore best practices in water conservation governance and operations
 - **\$275,000**

Status of Grant Fallowing Agreement Encumbrances and Expenditures

- \$865,000 has been encumbered towards the pilot groundwater conservation pilot program.
- Approximately 1,300 acres of irrigated land are participating.
- □ The total number of grant agreements is 24
 - Some agreements having multiple parcels
- The payment dispersal for the grantee is estimated to be:
 - 75% of the total encumbrance in FY2021
 - 25% of the total encumbrance will occur in FY2022

Next Steps

- Work to establish an entity to manage a long-term Program
- Develop hydrological studies to evaluate management actions including
 - Reduction of water consumption
 - Aquifer respondence
 - Improvement to surface water delivery efficiency
- Implement next round of Groundwater Conservation Grant Program
