

### American Rescue Plan Act

- \$5 million
- Facilities outside Santa Fe County
- Funds must be encumbered by 12/31/24 and expended by 12/31/26
  - Bosque Redondo/Ft. Sumner: Canal repair; Fire mitigation/brush control
  - **Ft. Stanton:** New water and wastewater system
  - **Jemez:** Fire detection in Visitor Center
  - Lincoln: Preservation of Courthouse; Stabilization of Tunstall Store
  - Los Luceros: Stabilization and preservation of Hacienda and Storehouse
  - Space History: Stabilization and preservation of Rock Park artifacts
  - Taylor: Stabilization of Reynolds Store balcony

## Statewide Exhibitions

- 3–5-year planning horizon for an exhibition
- Typically, funding is a public-private partnership
- Changing exhibitions 2 weeks to 2 years
- "Permanent" exhibitions 5–10-year lifespan
- Opened 35 new exhibitions in FY23
- 41 exhibitions new and planned through 12/31/25, over 60% are outside of Santa Fe







### Department Staffing

- 508 FTEs
- 16% vacancy rate
   Lower than average State vacancy rate of 23%
- Record 190 new hires in FY23; 40% higher than FY22
- 22% internal promotion rate
- Turnover of 21% of STRM & PERM positions 35% with TEMP and interns Lower than average State vacancy rate of 43%
- 41% of agency staff have 10+ years of State tenure, almost all with DCA



#### Leadership Team

- 21 of 22 leadership positions are filled
- All Gov-ex employees retained during transition
- Turnover in 7 of 9 museums/historic sites directors over past 4 ½ yrs
  - Prior administration saw 6 of 9 turnover during 4 yrs
- More than half of the positions have served for 3+ yrs
- Average of 28 yrs experience in the field, or 500+ yrs total
- Graduates of Stanford, Cornell, Claremont, Columbia, US Naval Academy, St. John's, NMSU and UNM
