



Investing in Recovery

- EDD was one of only two major agencies to get back-to-back budget cuts for FY21 and FY22
- EDD's FY10 recurring budget: \$9.2 million w/o JTIP
- EDD's FY22 recurring budget: \$9 million w/o JTIP
- Accounting for inflation, FY22 funding is \$2.4 million less than in FY10
- Accounting for other designated uses, funding for operating the department is:
 - \$2.9 million less than in FY10 *a reduction of more than 30%*
- We have 52 authorized FTEs vs 70 in FY10
- Despite the staffing and funding challenges, we have been remarkably effective
 - FY21 was our best job creation year since FY08 5,012 jobs!
- Our staff have been amazing during the COVID crisis and have helped thousands of businesses and people across the state, but their capacity is maxed out
- More funding for staff and operations = even more job creation and economic recovery

Intel Expansion

\$3.5B investment to modernize RR facility

- Domestic hub for advanced semiconductor manufacturing
- ■700 permanent jobs
- ■1,000 construction jobs
- ■\$550M in construction
- ■\$5M LEDA investment



BlueHalo Campus

The Max Q location will be a 200,000 SF campus, consolidating all the company's ABQ employees in one facility

- 64 jobs
- Average salary of \$105K
- Private investment of \$60M
- 10-year economic impact of \$3.2B



MTX Group

MTX provides technology consulting and will hire directly from CNM and other NM colleges

- 250 jobs
- Average salary = \$90-\$175K
- Private investment of \$2M
- 10-year economic impact of \$354.6M



Green Stream Farms

Green Stream Farms grows algae for use in Omega-3 nutrition products

- 23 jobs
- Private investment of \$7M
- 10-year economic impact of \$33M



WTEC Energy

WTEC will occupy a former Alpo dog food processing facility in Chamberino to manufacture steel wire for solar and wind energy units

- **315** jobs
- Private investment of \$22.15M
- 10-year economic impact of \$409M

A Call to Action Ensuring Strategy Success

- *NM's business community needs to adapt to rapidly changing times and be prepared to pay higher wages, increase schedule flexibility and provide greater options to attract employees.
- NM's business community & economic development activists need to join calls for increased EDD funding from the legislature; provide financial assistance to local EDOs and COGs; put more boots on the ground; increase capacity to garner federal funding & grow resources
- **EDD, HED and the higher education system** need to collaborate to give incoming students the information necessary to choose careers in high-demand areas; degree and certification programs must meet the current and future needs of industry in the state
- *Policymakers need to recognize that major changes to the economy will require significant funding for EDD and economic development programs.



New Mexico cannot continue on the path it has pursued in prior years – this plan provides a new path forward and the state must now provide funding and take action.

Successes & Needs for Each Division

Economic Development Division

A record-setting year:

- 5,012 jobs
- 74 companies supported by JTIP
- 21 LEDA projects
 - \$19B (10-year) economic impact
 - Annual payroll = \$241.6M
 - Average salary of \$79K

Special Appropriation Requests

Marketing the State

- \$1.5 million for business marketing for target industries
- \$500,000 for collaborative marketing initiative with local EDOs
- \$250,000 for ORD marketing and creating industry marketing materials

Addressing Infrastructure Gaps

- * \$30 million for traditional LEDA projects
- \$50 million for LEDA community-owned business and industrial park infrastructure projects
 - This would create shovel-ready sites to compete with other states
- \$10 million for ORD Outdoor Equity Fund and Outdoor Recreation Trails
- \$1.5 million to create new bioscience incubator

Building the Workforce

- \$50 million for a film academy
- \$5 million \$7 million for JTIP (total of \$12 million but need to build base budget)
