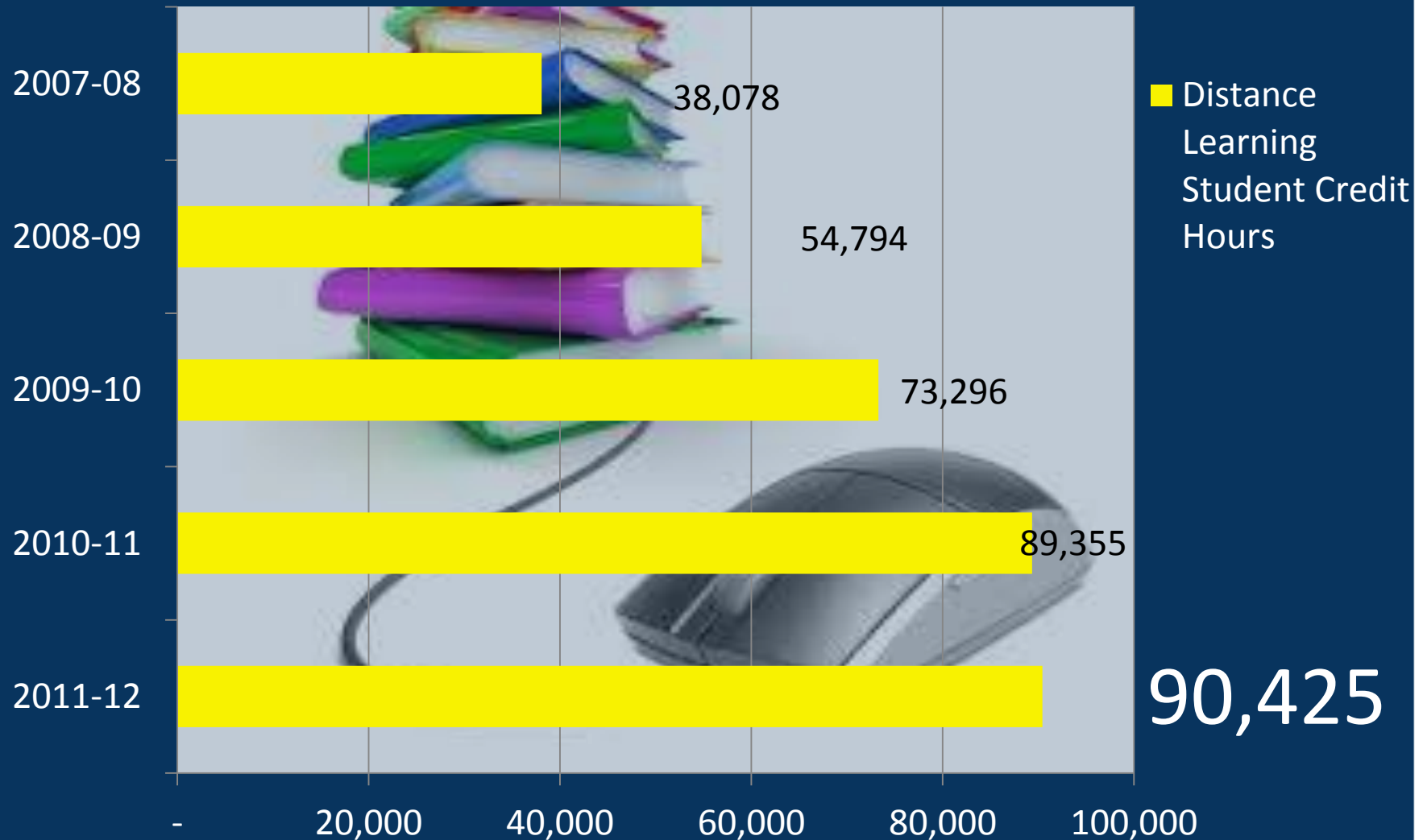

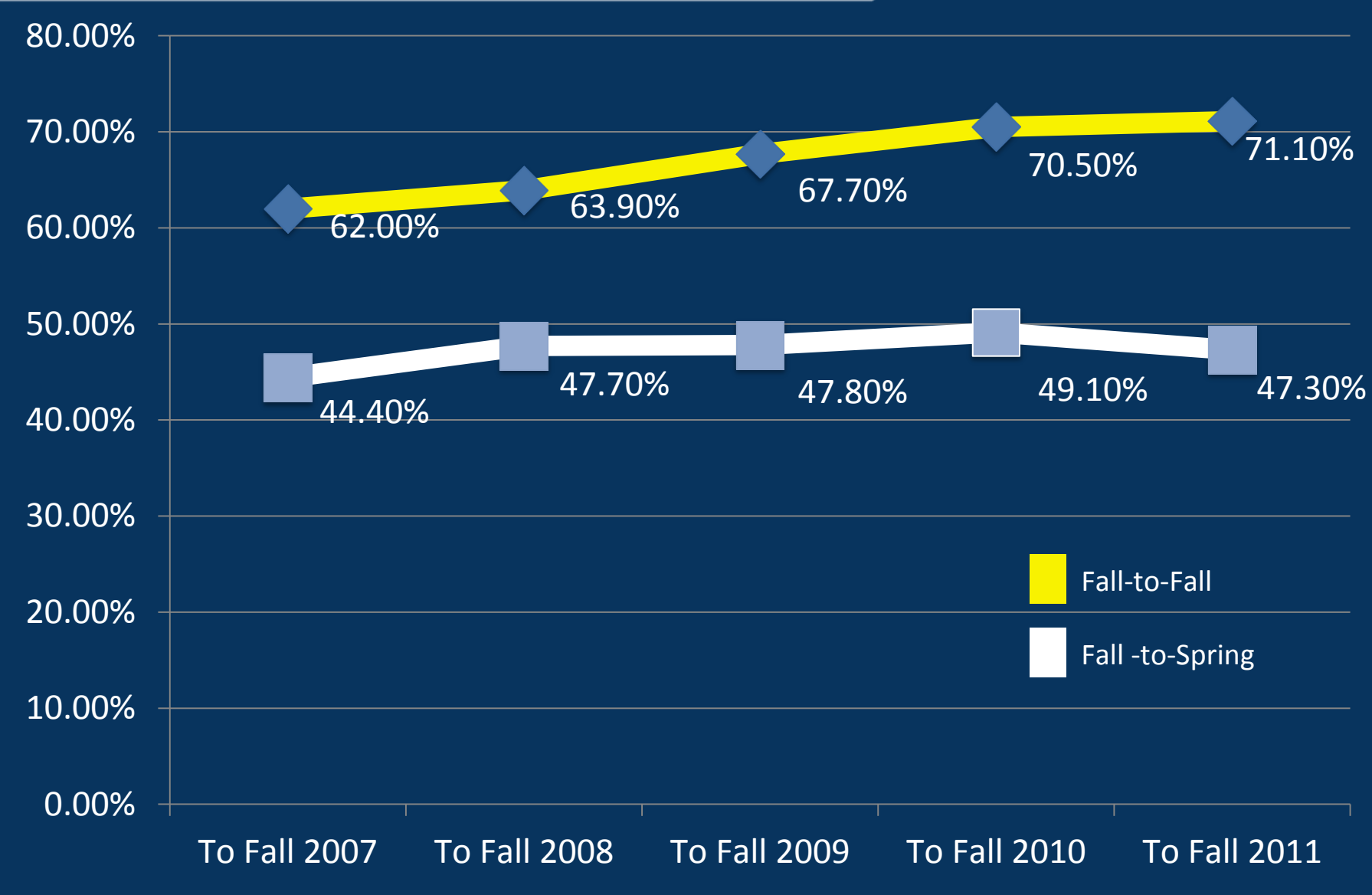

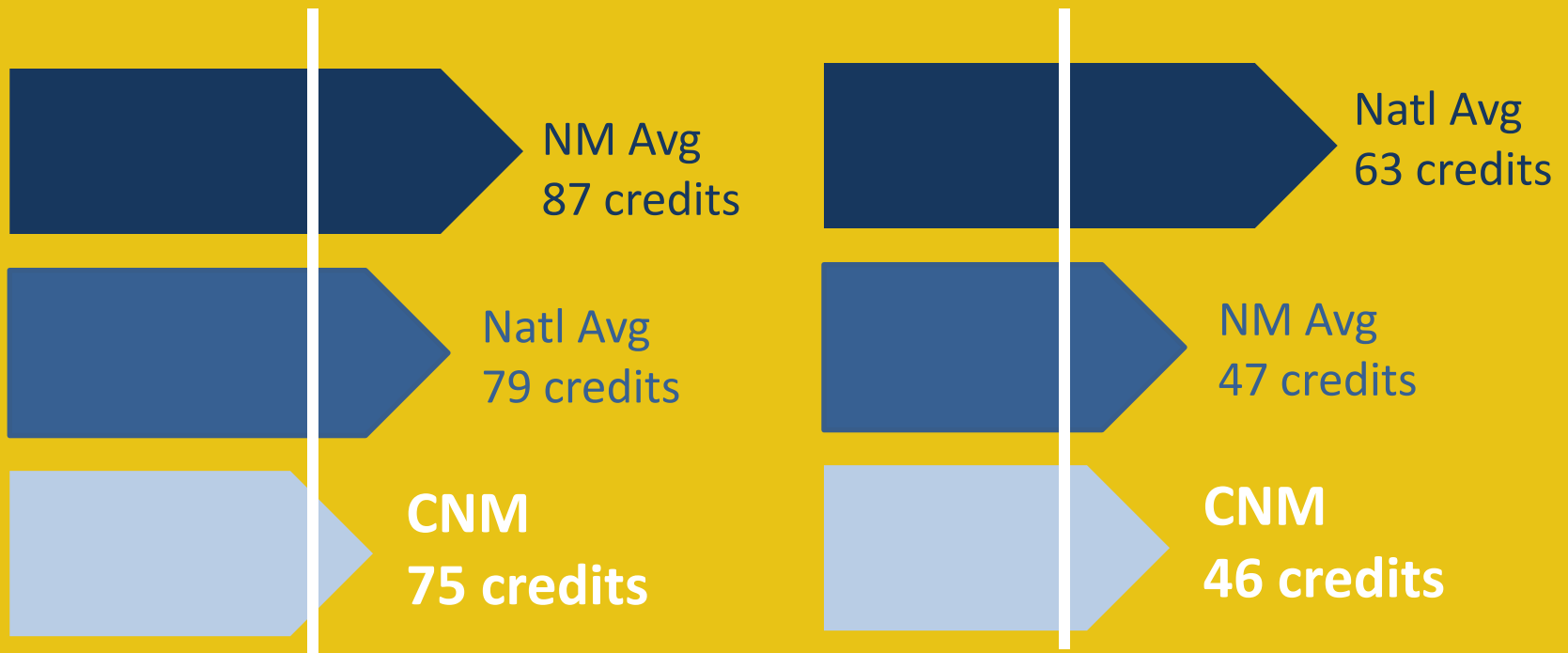


First-Time Student Retention

30 credit hours

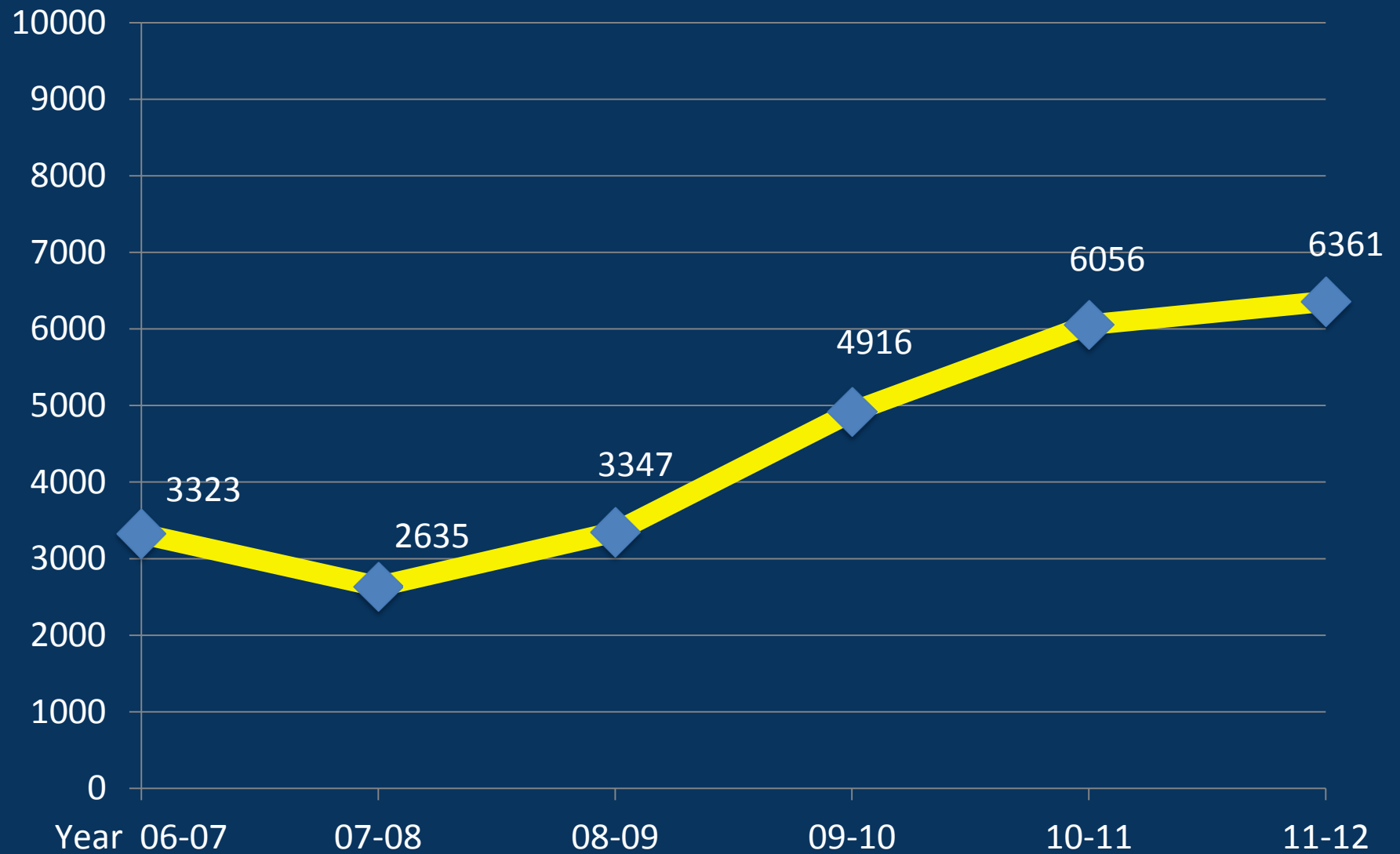
Behavioral Health Issues

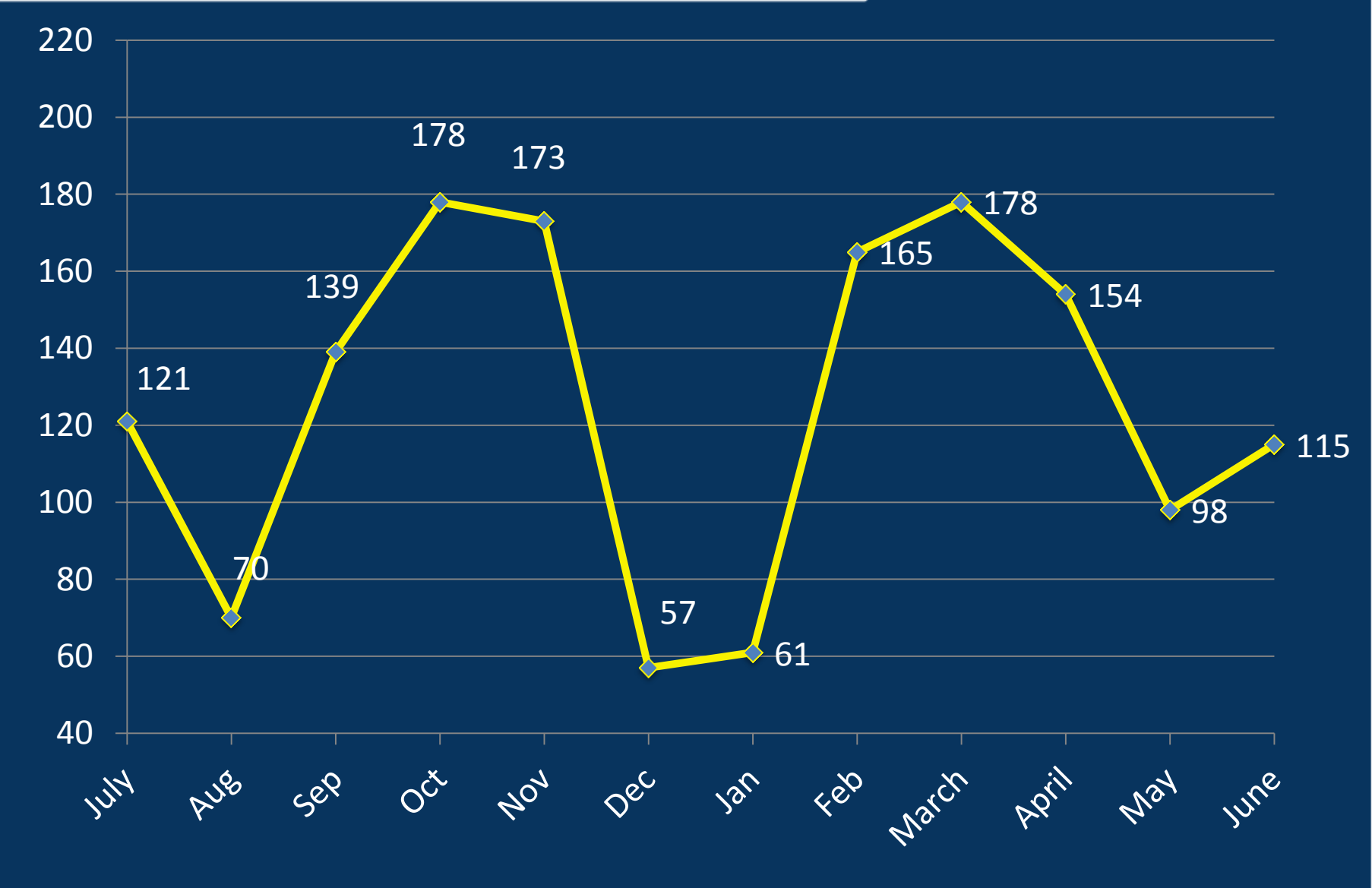

CNM Student Health Center Annual Visits



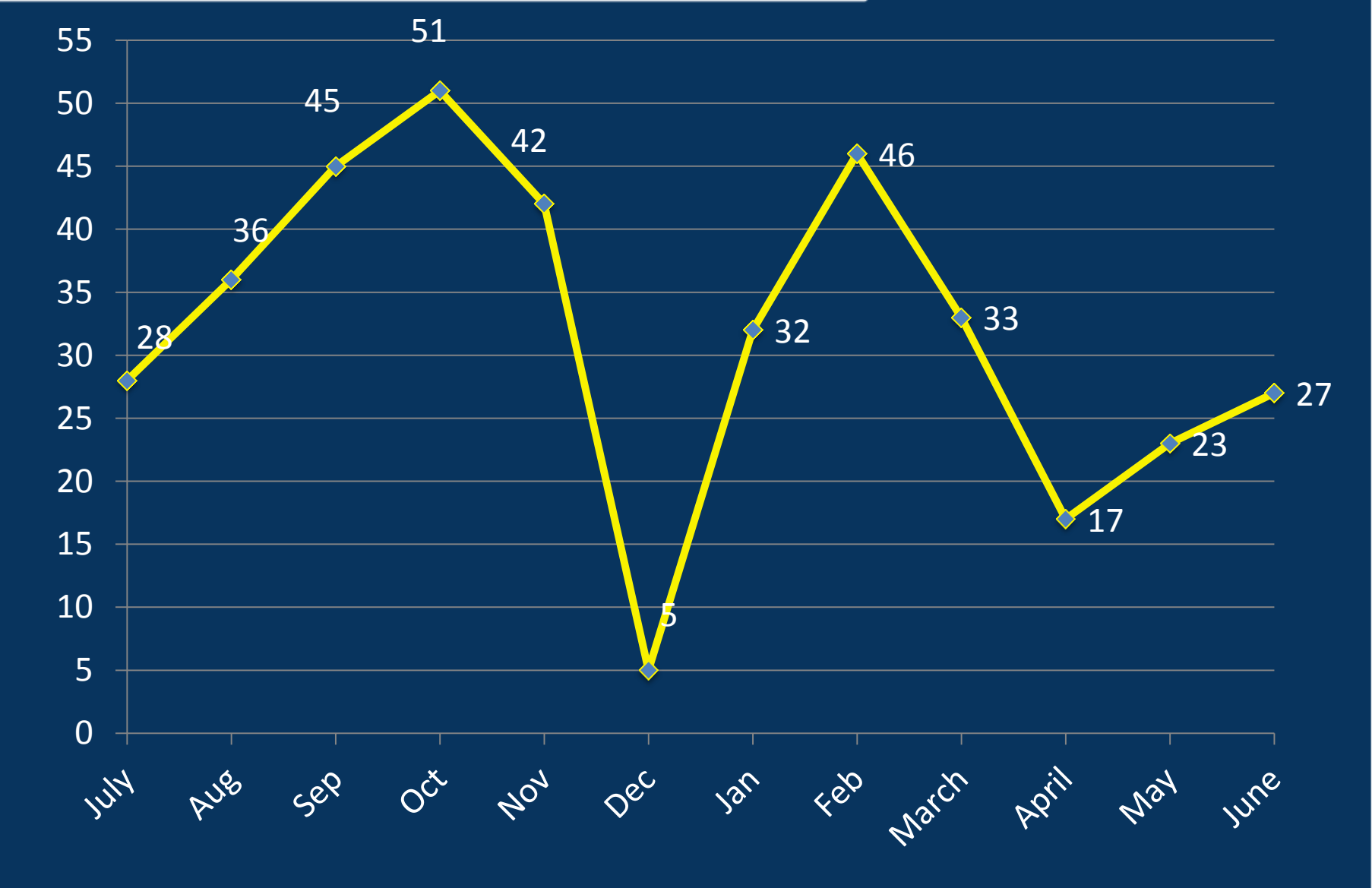
CNM Student Health Center Counseling Sessions

1,503 sessions



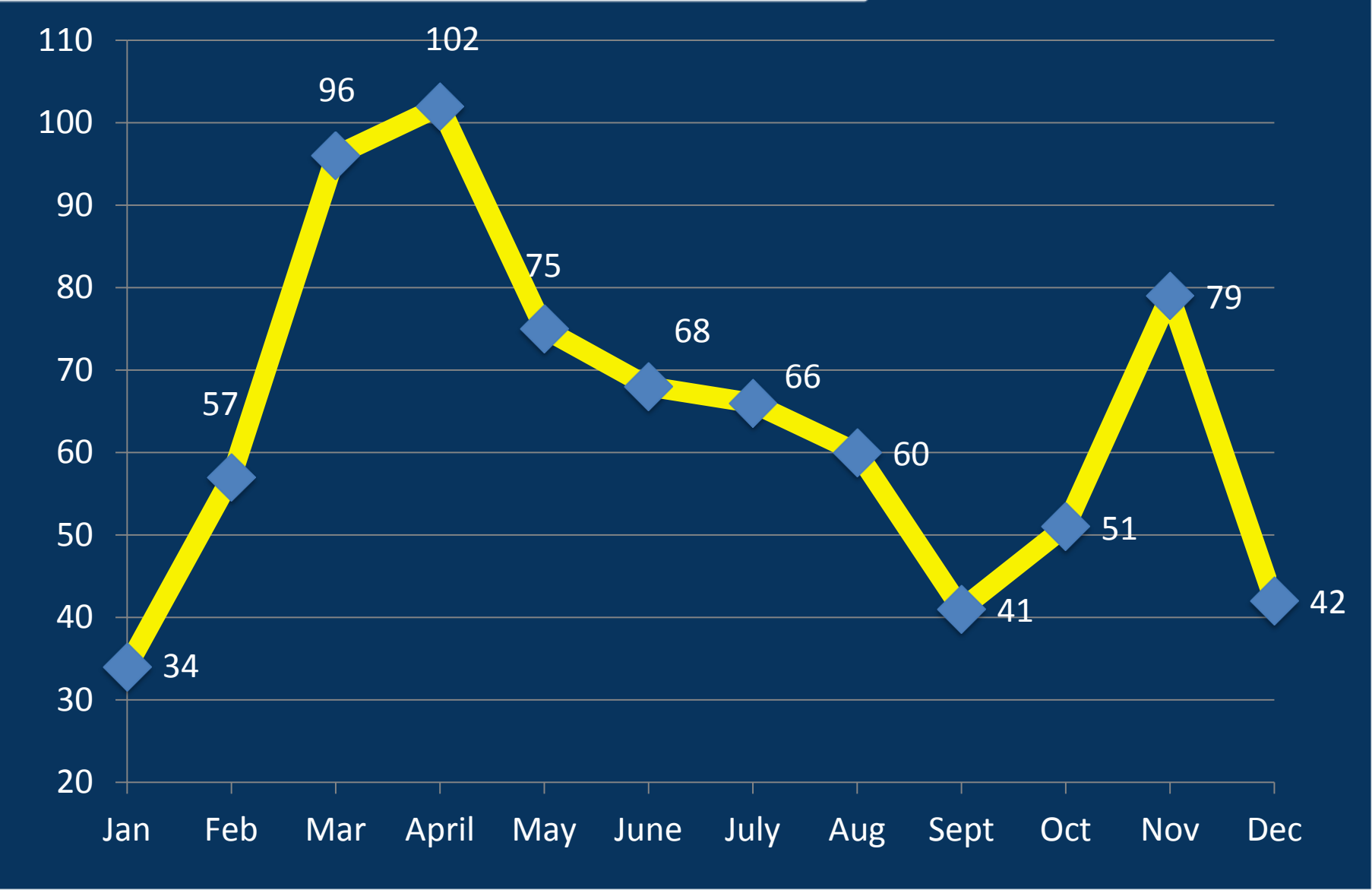
CNM Student Health Center Referrals to Outside Agencies
