

THE VULNERABILITIES OF CHILDREN IN CUSTODY

- > 60 % have a psychiatric diagnosis, excluding substance abuse
- > 80 % have a significant substance abuse problem, in addition to whatever else they have
- > 70 % have histories of serious neglect and abuse

THE VULNERABILITIES OF CHILDREN IN CUSTODY

- *THE FULL RANGE OF PSYCHIATRIC DIAGNOSES*
 - Posttraumatic Stress Disorder
 - Schizophrenia
 - Bipolar Affective Disorder (genuine)
 - Autism Spectrum Disorders
 - Major Depressive Disorders
 - Anxiety Disorders
 - Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder

THE LONG TERM EFFECTS OF NEGLECT AND ABUSE

- Neglect and abuse underlies the overwhelming majority of the mental health and behavioral problems of custody children in every system
 - *Depression*
 - *Extreme mood changes*
 - *Substance abuse*
 - *Attachment difficulties*
 - *Behavior dysregulation*

THE LONG TERM EFFECTS OF NEGLECT AND ABUSE

- **ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACE Study)**
 - Four times the rate of depression
 - Three to five times the rate of substance abuse
 - Five to nine times the rate of delinquency and behavior problems
 - Twice the rate of domestic violence
 - Decreased IQ
 - Physical disorders including early death, obesity, heart disease, and autoimmune disorders

CHILD TRAUMA ACADEMY

MODEL PROGRAMMING

- **Cambiar—The Missouri Model**
 - Positive Peer Culture
 - Rehabilitative rather than punitive
 - Emphasis on change and progress and transition
 - Smaller units
 - Decreased violence
 - Graduated Sanctions
- **All Facilities and All Programs**
 - Repeated Training and Maintenance
 - New Mexico Ownership

JJS INTAKE DIAGNOSTICS

- One PhD Clinical Psychologist Director
- Five Independently Licensed Diagnosticians
- A Consensus Diagnosis from:
 - Behavioral Health
 - Medical
 - Psychiatry
 - Education

JJS INTAKE SERVICES— ASSESSMENT and Treatment

- In Addition to Behavioral Health:
 - Medical
 - Educational
 - Dental
 - Psychiatric
 - Behavioral Health

INTAKE DIAGNOSIS and PLACEMENT

- CONSENSUS PLACEMENT ACCORDING TO:
 - Diagnosis
 - Behavior
 - Criminal history
 - Gender
 - Level of safety
 - Treatment needs

INTAKE DIAGNOSIS and PLACEMENT

- **AVAILABLE PROGRAMS**

- **CAMINO NUEVO YOUTH CENTER**

- 2 mental health units
 - 1 sex offender unit
 - 1 substance abuse unit
 - 3 female units

- **YOUTH DIAGNOSTIC AND DEVELOPMENT CENTER**

- 7 behavior management units with substance abuse, case management, individual and family therapy, transition services

INTAKE DIAGNOSIS and PLACEMENT

- **JOHN PAUL TAYLOR CENTER**

- Las Cruces Regional Placement
 - Behavior management, substance abuse, case management, educational, individual and family therapy, transition services

- **SAN JUAN JUVENILE DETENTION CENTER**

- Behavior management, substance abuse, case management, educational, individual and family therapy, transition services

OFF-SITE TREATMENT NEEDS

- Consensus decision to place patients off-site based upon needs that exceed facility capacity or best interest of patient
- Criteria for off-site placement
- **Males:** Sequoyah Adolescent Treatment Center
- **Females:** Desert Hills Residential Treatment Center

CHILDREN IN THE CUSTODY OF PROTECTIVE SERVICES

- **IN-HOUSE SERVICES**
 - Case Management / Supervision
 - In Home Services
- **CONTRACTED SERVICES**
 - Family Support to High Risk and Foster Parents
 - In Home Services
 - Domestic Violence Prevention
 - Contractors: Community providers
 - No Therapy

CHILDREN IN THE CUSTODY OF PROTECTIVE SERVICES

- **MEDICAID SERVICES**
 - *Treatment Foster Care*
 - *Acute Inpatient Psychiatric Care*
 - *Residential Treatment Centers*
 - *Substance Abuse Intensive Outpatient Programs*
 - *Outpatient Therapy*
 - *Medication Management*
 - *CCSS—Comprehensive Community Support Services*

JUVENILE JUSTICE SERVICES

- *EIGHT CONTINUOUS YEARS OF PROGRAM RENOVATION*
- *STATE OF ART DIAGNOSTIC AND TREATMENT PROGRAMS*
- *DECREASED VIOLENCE*
- *REHABILITATION FOCUSED PROGRAMMING*
- *INTENSIVE REINTEGRATION EFFORTS*
