Pretrial Justice Guiding Principles

"In our society, liberty is the norm and detention prior to trial or without trial is the carefully limited exception." U.S. v. Salerno

- Presumption of innocence
- Use of least restrictive conditions to reasonably ensure court appearance and public safety
- Preventative detention only when no conditions can be applied to reasonably protect public safety

Pretrial Justice is a system, not a program or a tool

Pretrial Systems utilize legal and evidence-based practices to promote return to court and public safety

Arrest Booking Diversion Court Appearance Pretrial Supervision

- Least restrictive
- Practices shown to work
- Risk principle

Roles of Pretrial Services Agencies

- Help courts make informed bail decisions
- Promote release, maximize court appearance, maximize public safety, and increase successful outcomes
- Measure pretrial justice outcomes to ensure legal and evidence-based practices are implemented and followed

Provide information to the Court to assist judicial officers with the pretrial release decision

Provide supervision and services ordered by the court Pretrial Investigation and Risk Assessment




Public Safety Assessments (PSA) and Background Investigations Reports (BIR) completed by AOC BI/PSA Unit and provided to the courts in FY22: **10,212**



Pretrial Supervised Outcomes

(Current AOC Pretrial Sites Only)

- □ **3595** cases under pretrial supervision closed between October 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022
 - □ 2786 (77%) of defendants
 appeared for all court hearings
 while under supervision
 - □ 3085 (86%) of defendants were not charged with a new crime while under supervision
 - □ 3403 (95%) of defendants were not charged with a new violent crime while under supervision



Pretrial Supervision - We Measure Risk to Manage Risk

Effective Pretrial Supervision includes legal and evidence-based practices shown to promote success (maximizing court appearance, minimizing continued criminal activity, and maximizing public safety):

- Matching supervision levels to likelihood of a person's pretrial success - individualized approach
- Court date reminders
- Contact with defendants
- GPS for some defendants tool used to monitor other conditions
- Prompt notice of non-compliance to the court and parties
- Responding to compliance and non-compliance
- Remembering pretrial is not probation
- "Less is more" approach, produces higher rates of success

Supervision Numbers:

- In FY22, 4101 defendants were actively supervised by a local AOC Pretrial Services Program.
- On July 21, 2022 there were 1162 defendants actively reporting to a local AOC Pretrial Services Program that day.
- In FY22, 3426 Intakes were completed by a local AOC Pretrial Services Program.


Electronic Monitoring & Supervision (EMS) Unit Data



NM DataXchange Benefits:

- Real time performance measures and outcomes
- AOC Pretrial Justice Program can filter data and create reports
- The platform is active and expanding to multiple criminal justice stakeholders
- The platform allows for integration of criminal justice data from multiple sources (Courts, jails, law enforcement, etc...)
- Follows national best practice for high functioning systems
- Ability to measure pretrial system as a whole, not just court data (ex. cite and release practices, pretrial detention length of stay)
