Fair Districts for New Mexico - Redistricting Reform in New Mexico

In July 2019 the League of Women Voters of New Mexico (LWVNM) received funding from the Thornburg Foundation to conduct the Fair Districts for New Mexico (FDNM) campaign. FDNM now has 26 organizations (see list below) that have joined together to support fair, transparent and trusted redistricting following the 2020 census.

FDNM partner organizations worked to pass the **Redistricting Act** in the 2021 legislative session. That legislation created the Citizen Redistricting Committee (CRC). The seven-member CRC is charged with developing three recommended district maps for the three New Mexico Congressional seats, the New Mexico House and Senate, as well as the Public Education Commission. The CRC will send their recommended district maps to the Legislature. The Legislature will meet in special session in December to vote on the maps. The Legislature can amend any of the recommended maps. **FDNM will be asking the Legislature to accept the preferred district maps presented to them by the CRC without amendment.** Since district maps are legislation they will need to be signed by the Governor.
