

We are moving towards a paperless system. We have started with converting search requests and match comparisons records to an electronic format and will be converting testing records in the future. Once complete we will focus on incoming documentation.

Using federal grant funding we have completely upgraded and replaced all CODIS computers (servers and workstations) and all software state wide. (NMDIS, DPS and ABQ PD)

We have grant funding currently allocated towards upgrading all sample tracking software and computers as well as the sample collection website used by the collectors for onsite tracking and confirmation of collections. We have a target completion date of July 2017

We are in the process of converting to a new DNA “megaplex” testing kit to address new requirements put out by the Federal Bureau of investigation. We have a target completion date of January 1, 2017.
