14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. Section 10-11-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987,
16	Chapter 253, Section 8, as amended by Laws 2014, Chapter 35,
17	Section 1 and by Laws 2014, Chapter 39, Section 1 and also by
18	Laws 2014, Chapter 43, Section 1) is amended to read:
19	"10-11-8. NORMAL RETIREMENTRETURN TO EMPLOYMENT
20	BENEFITS CONTINUEDCONTRIBUTIONS
21	A. A member may retire upon fulfilling the
22	following requirements prior to the selected date of
23	retirement:
24	(1) a written application for normal
25	retirement, in the form prescribed by the association, is filed

1 with the association;

2 (2) employment is terminated with all
3 employers covered by any state system or the educational
4 retirement system;

5 (3) the member selects an effective date of
6 retirement that is the first day of a calendar month; and

coverage plan applicable to the member.

B. The amount of normal retirement pension is
determined in accordance with the coverage plan applicable to
the member.

C. Except as provided in Subsection E of this section, on or after July 1, 2010, a retired member may be subsequently employed by an affiliated public employer only pursuant to the following provisions:

(1) the retired member has not been employed as an employee of an affiliated public employer or retained as an independent contractor by the affiliated public employer from which the retired member retired for at least twelve consecutive months from the date of retirement to the commencement of subsequent employment or reemployment with an affiliated public employer;

(2) the retired member's pension shall be suspended upon commencement of the subsequent employment; .215963.1SA - 2 -

except as provided in Subsection G of this (3) section, the retired member shall not become a member and shall not accrue service credit, and the retired member and that person's subsequent affiliated public employer shall not make contributions under any coverage plan pursuant to the Public Employees Retirement Act; and

(4) upon termination of the subsequent employment, the retired member's pension shall resume in 8 accordance with the provisions of Subsection A of this section.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection B D. of Section 10-11-118 NMSA 1978, on and after July 1, 2013, if a retired member becomes employed with an employer pursuant to the Educational Retirement Act, and effective July 1, 2014, if a retired member who, subsequent to retirement, is employed and covered pursuant to the Judicial Retirement Act, and, effective July 1, 2014, if a retired member who, subsequent to retirement, is employed and covered pursuant to the Magistrate Retirement Act:

(1)the retired member's cost-of-living pension adjustment shall be suspended upon commencement of the employment; and

(2) upon termination of the employment, the retired member's suspended cost-of-living pension adjustment shall be reinstated as provided under Subsection B of Section 10-11-118 NMSA 1978.

The provisions of Subsections C, H and I of this 2 section do not apply to: (1) a retired member employed by the 3 legislature for legislative session work; 4 (2) a retired member employed by a court to 5 serve as a bailiff; 6 7 [(2)] (3) a retired member employed temporarily as a precinct board member for a municipal election 8 9 or an election covered by the Election Code; or [(3)] (4) a retired member who is elected to 10 serve a term as an elected official in an office covered 11 12 pursuant to the Public Employees Retirement Act; provided that: (a) the retired member files an 13 irrevocable exemption from membership with the association 14 within thirty days of taking office; and 15 (b) the irrevocable exemption shall be 16 for the elected official's term of office. 17 F. 5 employee and employer contributions, and the previously retired

9 terminates the subsequent employment with an affiliated public
10 employer, the previously retired member shall retire according
11 to the provisions of the Public Employees Retirement Act,

retired member's suspended cost-of-living pension adjustment shall be reinstated as provided under Subsection B of Section 10-11-118 NMSA 1978.

J. The pension of a member who has earned service credit under more than one coverage plan shall be determined as follows:

7 (1) the pension of a member who has three or
8 more years of service credit earned on or before June 30, 2013
9 under each of two or more coverage plans shall be determined in
10 accordance with the coverage plan that produces the highest
11 pension;

(2) the pension of a member who has service credit earned on or before June 30, 2013 under two or more coverage plans but who has three or more years of service credit under only one of those coverage plans shall be determined in accordance with the coverage plan in which the member has three or more years of service credit. If the service credit is acquired under two different coverage plans applied to the same affiliated public employer as a consequence of an election by the members, adoption by the affiliated public employer or a change in the law that results in the application of a coverage plan with a greater pension, the greater pension shall be paid a member retiring from the affiliated public employer under which the change in coverage plan took place regardless of the amount of service credit

under the coverage plan producing the greater pension; provided that the member has three or more years of continuous employment with that affiliated public employer immediately preceding or immediately preceding and immediately following the date the coverage plan changed;

(3) the pension of a member who has service credit earned on or before June 30, 2013 under each of two or more coverage plans and who has service credit earned under any coverage plan on or after July 1, 2013 shall be equal to the sum of:

(a) the pension attributable to the service credit earned on or before June 30, 2013 determined pursuant to Paragraph (1) or (2) of this subsection; and (b) the pension attributable to the service credit earned under each coverage plan on or after July 1, 2013;

(4) the pension of a member who has service credit earned only on and after July 1, 2013 shall be equal to the sum of the pension attributable to the service credit the member has accrued under each coverage plan; and

(5) the provisions of each coverage plan for the purpose of this subsection shall be those in effect at the time the member ceased to be covered by the coverage plan. "Service credit", for the purposes of this subsection, shall be only personal service rendered an affiliated public employer .215963.1SA
