

New Mexico WIOA State Combined Plan:

WIOA reforms planning requirements, previously governed by the Workforce Investment Act of 1998, or WIA, to foster better alignment of federal investments in job training, integrate service delivery across programs, improve efficiency in service delivery, and ensure that the workforce system is job-driven and matches employers with skilled individuals. Under WIOA, the State Plan communicates the State's vision for the New Mexico workforce system and serves as a vehicle for aligning and integrating this system across federal programs. On April 1, 2016, the New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions submitted the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Combined State Plan for the State of New Mexico to the appropriate federal oversight agencies on behalf of the Core and Combined Plan partner programs highlighted in the Plan.
