## Small-scale, Regenerative Farming is Key to a Just Economic Transition

Utopia Valley LLC creates **value-added food & other products** utilizing our organic and regenerative practices/ingredients. <u>We prepare</u>: Dehydrated Culinary/Medicinal Herbs (for spices, tea &/or salves); Baked goods, Jams & Jellies. Smudge sticks: using Eucalyptus leaves (we have 2 trees), sage, and other herbs and flowers grown at Utopia Valley LLC.

#### Barriers to investment I've experienced my farm/food business include:

- Gender Discrimination- Female
- Ethnicity- Hispanic
- Small farmer (3+ acres in production)
- PPP Covid loan obstacles at bank (possibly given to aforementioned reasons)
- Climate Change- weather changes, plants bolting (seeding sooner), drought stressed due to decreased water
- Water: Drip Systems- Initial investment cost/continual maintenance. More water efficient yet increased sodium. EBID/Well water concerns- aquifer strain, periodic safety concerns, allocations to non-food use in NM/TX. Abuses by other industries/large farms as well as.

## What is Possible with Sufficient Investment?



- Be Community Food Hub- North Valley aggregation site for La Semilla & neighbor farmers
- Build Small Solar Commercial Greenhouse/Kitchen- Teach community classes/workshops: food safety, preparation, cooking, marketing, clothing construction, arts/crafts. Prior experience: Foods and Nutrition Teacher at The American School Foundation- Mexico City, Family & Consumer Sciences Teacher- Picacho Middle School in Las Cruces, NM. Also taught bilingual adults food safety and preparation nutrition workshops in Rio Arriba and Taos County for NMSU Cooperative Extension Service.
- Employ More People- Diverse areas of farm: Field- pecan orchard, regenerative ag area, culinary garden (spices), medicinal herbs (teas); other transition areas: beans/lentils; fruit trees; Art Studio/Gallery- make jewelry and paint; Kitchen- test/create more value-added food products, etc...
- Offer salary/benefits- Many small farmers have multiple roles to be sustainable.

### Mountain View Market Close-Out Items:

- Stainless Steel: 6-burner Gas range; Pizza oven; 3 Compartment Sink; 13 Knives; Grocery Cart

## A Liveable Future is Possible By Investing in Small Farmers

- Increased Local Food; Decreased energy/resource waste-less transport/gasoline/pollution.
- Nutritious and delicious foods- picked ripe/fresh, not green.
- Increased community health/wellness- mental, physical, spiritual. Farming can be therapeutic. Working with the soil/plants can be restorative, plus it builds character and keeps you humble.
- Regenerative, agroecological and beyond organic practices strengthen communities.
- **Community Workshops/Collaboration-** Agriculture, marketing, climate change discussions- impact on plants environment, drought, winds, rains, insects +/-, plants bolting early.
- More efficient water use- Consider environmental impacts. Water concerns given:





EBID (Elephant Butte Irrigation District) allocations- only 1 irrigation Summer 2021
DAMDWA (Dona Ana Mutual Domestic Water Association)- Drip system runs on this-- costly as County water rates are more expensive than city. Collaboration with NIFI (National Immigrant Farming Institute) in El Paso, TX provided materials/labor to get 4 areas of Utopia Valley on drip.
Well- Aquifer safety concerns- strain & equity disparity- larger farmers' disproportionate amount over-use/abuse by purchasing from small farmers/pumping water to fill 2-3 areas of EBID laterals that extend miles down road to sell it to other industries and larger farmers. Food produced is not staying local.
Shipped to other states/countries, yet we still have children/community members hungry here.
Produced Water- Fracking may contaminate aquifers/nature/food production in various areas. Need

"independent" research re: fracking impacts, not US Dept of Energy &/or oil industry funded studies.
