Aviation Division Mandates

- Encourage and advance aviation in New Mexico

- Assemble and Distribute information relating to Aviation
- Responsible for the registration of all aircraft based in New Mexico and for the licensing of aircraft dealers
- Conducts an Air Service Assistance Program **(SUNSETS JUNE 30th, 2021)**
- Provide a safe and effective aviation system plan
New Mexico State Aviation System Plan – 2017



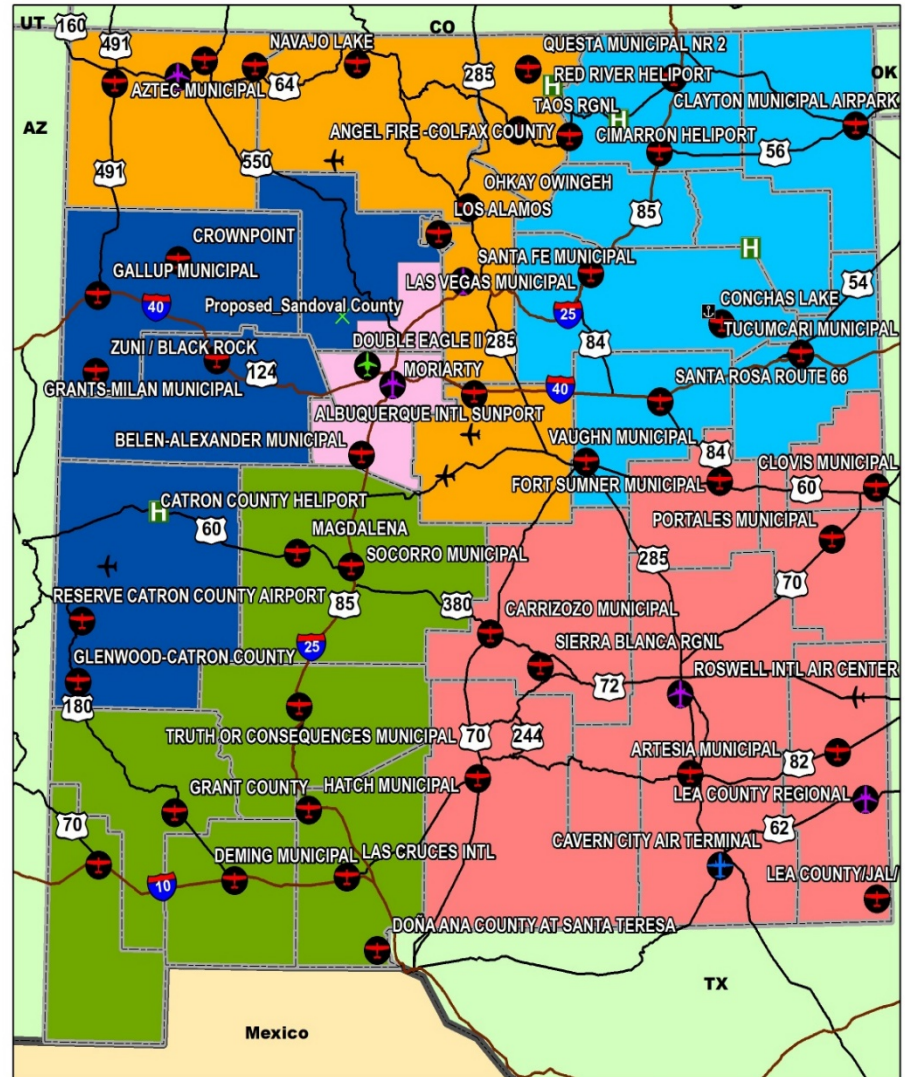
Aviation Division Functions

- Provides planning and technical support in developing and maintaining the State's airports and other elements of the aviation system
- Coordinates with Federal and local governments for improvement of aviation infrastructure – Safety and Maintenance of pavements, navigational aids, other fixed assets and equipment
- Publish the New Mexico Aeronautical Chart
- Promulgates rules for enforcement of aviation laws
- Perform regulatory and compliance inspections – FAA 5010 Airfield Safety Inspection
- New Initiatives – Passport to Adventure and Discovery Flight

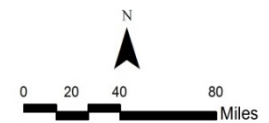


New Mexico Airport System

- USDA Rural Development strongly encourages the consideration of public-private partnerships (P3s) in the development of rural transportation infrastructure projects. P3s provide a mechanism for greater private-sector participation in all phases of the development and financing of such projects. Early involvement of the private sector promotes creativity, efficiency, and brings capital to bear when addressing complex transportation infrastructure projects.
- One of the best ways for an organization or community to begin the rural transportation infrastructure project process is to speak with a local USDA Rural Development representative. Even if, ultimately, Community Facilities Program funding is not the final outcome for the project, USDA is always available to assist rural communities and will be able to connect prospective project teams with successful peers and resources in the region.
