

What Is Apprenticeship?

- Apprenticeship is a combination of classroom training and on-the-job training hours. Upon completion an apprentice receives a certificate of completion from the NM Department of Workforce Solutions.



- There are 35 state approved apprenticeship programs in the State of New Mexico.

- Program length varies from 1-5 years depending on occupation.

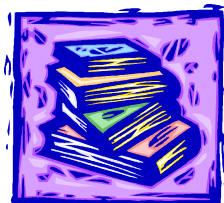
Industry Driven— Industry Supported
