AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SUNSET ACT; PROVIDING FOR THE SUNSET OF ALL ADMINISTRATIVELY ATTACHED AND ADJUNCT AGENCIES AND ALL BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COUNCILS, TASK FORCES, COMMITTEES AND OTHER MEMBERSHIP ENTITIES OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH; REPEALING THE INTERTRIBAL CEREMONIAL OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Sunset Act is enacted to read:

"NEW MATERIAL SUNSET ACT--APPLICABILITY REQUIRED FOR ALL ADMINISTRATIVELY ATTACHED AND ADJUNCT AGENCIES AND OTHERS.--

Unless explicitly exempted by the legislature, the Sunset Act applies to every administratively attached and adjunct agency and every board, commission, council, task force, committee and other membership entity of the executive branch. The

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1 legislature shall provide for sunset review in any legislation  
2 that creates an administratively attached or adjunct agency or  
3 membership entity."

4 SECTION 2. A new section of Chapter 1, Article 9 NMSA  
5 1978 is enacted to read:

6 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
7 REPEAL.--The voting system certification committee is  
8 terminated on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The  
9 committee shall continue to operate according to the provisions  
10 of Section 1-9-7.5 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016. Effective  
11 July 1, 2016, Section 1-9-7.5 NMSA 1978 is repealed."

12 SECTION 3. A new section of the Main Street Revolving  
13 Loan Act is enacted to read:

14 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
15 REPEAL.--The main street revolving loan committee is terminated  
16 on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The committee  
17 shall continue to operate according to the provisions of the  
18 Main Street Revolving Loan Act until July 1, 2016. Effective  
19 July 1, 2016, Section 3-60C-4 NMSA 1978 is repealed."

20 SECTION 4. A new section of Chapter 6, Article 1 NMSA  
21 1978 is enacted to read:

22 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
23 REPEAL.--The state board of finance is terminated on July 1,  
24 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The board shall continue to  
25 operate according to the provisions of Chapter 6, Article 1

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1 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016. Effective July 1, 2016, Chapter  
2 6, Article 1 NMSA 1978 is repealed."

3 SECTION 5. A new section of Chapter 6, Article 8 NMSA  
4 1978 is enacted to read:

5 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
6 REPEAL.--

7 A. The state investment council is terminated on  
8 July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The council shall  
9 continue to operate according to the provisions of Chapter 6,  
10 Article 8 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016. Effective July 1,  
11 2016, Chapter 6, Article 8 NMSA 1978 is repealed.

12 B. The private equity investment advisory committee  
13 is terminated on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The  
14 committee shall continue to operate according to the provisions  
15 of Chapter 6, Article 8 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016.  
16 Effective July 1, 2016, Section 6-8-20 NMSA 1978 is repealed."

17 [NOTE: This section would already be repealed by SIC repeal in  
18 previous section if that goes through.] [SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMEND

20 SECTION 6. A new section of the Tribal Infrastructure Act  
21 is enacted to read:

22 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
23 REPEAL.--The tribal infrastructure board is terminated on July  
24 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The board shall continue  
25 to operate according to the provisions of the Tribal

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1 Infrastructure Act until July 1, 2016. Effective July 1, 2016,  
2 the Tribal Infrastructure Act is repealed."

3 SECTION 7. A new section of the Colonias Infrastructure  
4 Act is enacted to read:

5 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
6 REPEAL.--The colonias infrastructure board is terminated on  
7 July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The board shall  
8 continue to operate according to the provisions of the Colonias  
9 Infrastructure Act until July 1, 2016. Effective July 1, 2016,  
10 the Colonias Infrastructure Act is repealed."

11 SECTION 8. A new section of the Children, Youth and  
12 Families Department Act is enacted to read:

13 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
14 REPEAL.--

15 A. The children, youth and families advisory  
16 committee is terminated on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset  
17 Act. The committee shall continue to operate according to the  
18 provisions of Section 9-2A-12 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016.  
19 Effective July 1, 2016, Section 9-2A-12 NMSA 1978 is repealed.

20 [SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION]

21 B. The juvenile justice advisory committee is  
22 terminated on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The  
23 committee shall continue to operate according to the provisions  
24 of Section 9-2A-14 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016. Effective  
25 July 1, 2016, Section 9-2A-14 NMSA 1978 is repealed. [CAUTION:

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1 Federal mandate.]

2 C. The New Mexico domestic violence leadership  
3 commission is terminated on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset  
4 Act. The commission shall continue to operate according to the  
5 provisions of Section 9-2A-24 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016.  
6 Effective July 1, 2016, Section 9-2A-24 NMSA 1978 is repealed."

7 SECTION 9. A new section of the Youth Alliance Act is  
8 enacted to read:

9 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
10 REPEAL.--The youth alliance is terminated on July 1, 2015  
11 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The alliance shall continue to  
12 operate according to the provisions of the Youth Alliance Act  
13 until July 1, 2016. Effective July 1, 2016, the Youth Alliance  
14 Act is repealed."

15 SECTION 10. A new section of the Corrections Department  
16 Act is enacted to read:

17 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
18 REPEAL.--

19 A. The New Mexico sentencing commission is  
20 terminated on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The  
21 commission shall continue to operate according to the  
22 provisions of Sections 9-3-10 through 9-3-10.2 NMSA 1978 until  
23 July 1, 2016. Effective July 1, 2016, Sections 9-3-10 through  
24 9-3-10.2 NMSA 1978 are repealed.

25 B. The sex offender management board is terminated

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1 on July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The board shall  
2 continue to operate according to the provisions of Section

6 SECTION 11. A new section of the New Mexico Youth

10 terminated on July 1, 2013 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The

23 1, 2014, Sections 9-15-11 and 9-15-12 NMSA 1978 are repealed."  
24 [COMMERCE DEPT ACT COMBINES EDC & TC (Section 18)]

25           SECTION 18. A new section of the Tourism Department Act

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1 is enacted to read:

2 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
3 REPEAL.--

4 A. The tourism commission is terminated on July 1,  
5 2013 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The commission shall continue  
6 to operate according to the provisions of Sections 9-15A-8 and  
7 9-15A-9 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2014. Effective July 1, 2014,  
8 Sections 9-15A-8 and 9-15A-9 NMSA 1978 are repealed. [SEE  
9 SECTION 17 NOTE]

10 B. The sports advisory committee is terminated on  
11 July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The committee shall  
12 continue to operate according to the provisions of Section  
13 9-15A-11 NMSA 1978 until July 1, 2016. Effective July 1, 2016,  
14 Section 9-15A-11 NMSA 1978 is repealed." [SUBCOM RECOMMEND  
15 ABOLISH]

16 SECTION 19. A new section of the Department of Public  
17 Safety Act is enacted to read:

18 "[NEW MATERIAL] TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED  
19 REPEAL.--The public safety advisory commission is terminated on  
20 July 1, 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The commission shall

25 SECTION 20. A new section of the Indian Affairs


