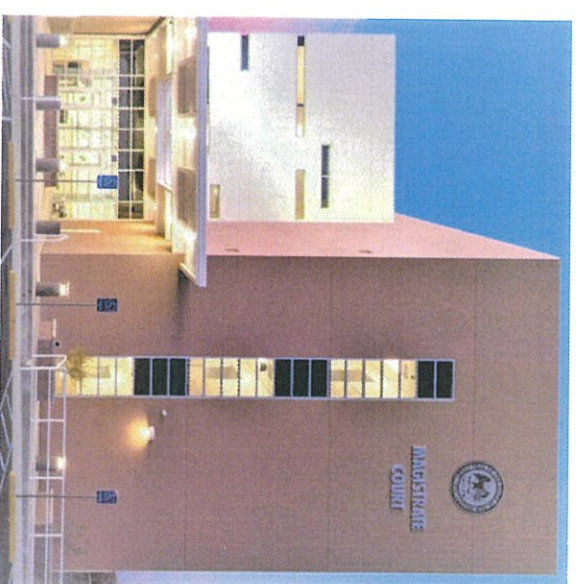
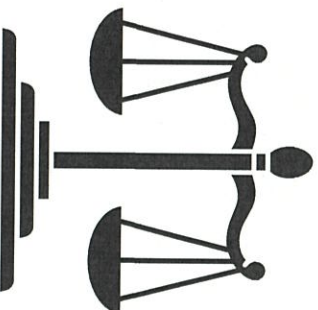

What is DWI Treatment Court?

An evidence-based, treatment focused program that combines judicial intervention, supervision, monitoring and treatment as an alternative to incarceration for certain high-risk, high-need individuals.

Mission Statement

The mission of the McKinley County DWI Treatment Court is to provide a healthier and safer community by promoting public safety, reducing DWI recidivism and decreasing criminal activity related to substance use.

DWI Treatment Court uses positive reinforcement and team collaboration to support a participant admitted into the program. A multi-disciplinary team approach helps to encourage growth, sobriety, problem solving, supervision and therapy.

Program Structure

The McKinley County DWI Treatment Court is a post-adjudication therapeutic court program that assists 2nd and 3rd DWI offenders through an intensive, treatment based supervision.

Participants who are screened and identified as having a moderate to high, alcohol/substance use dependency will receive treatment services such as:

- Detox Services
- Medically Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- Outpatient Treatment
- Group and Individual Therapy
- Case Management Services
- Residential and Extended Residential Treatment
- Recovery Support Groups
- Assistance Completing Court Ordered Mandates

Participants will be required to submit to frequent urinalysis testing, attend treatment services, meet frequently with Program Manager and/or Field Support Specialist, and appear for court status hearings regularly.

Why DWI Treatment Court?

- Therapeutic approach rather than traditional probation supervision
- Individualized treatment plan and case management
- Assistance obtaining employment/housing/benefits
- Possibility of remaining probation suspended or unsupervised upon successful completion of program
- Recovery support groups led by Treatment Court Alumni
- Peer support
- Sobriety!

Eligibility requirements:

- 18 years or older
- Reside within McKinley County
- Deemed high risk/high need by validated screening process
- Charged with 2nd or 3rd DWI and a minimum of 12 months probation (minimum 18 months preferred)
- Violent offenses – case by case basis
- No sex offenders
