26 programs: HSE prep, English instruction, & literacy with a workforce preparation focus; Integrated Education & Training (IET)


#### ADULT LITERACY

# HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE)


HSE testing (GED & HiSET); National External Diploma Program; serves whole state, not only AE and AL students

#### **Adult Education Enrollment: Native Students**







## ADULT EDUCATION ENROLLMENT


All Adult Education Systems have seen an increase in enrollment in the last program year. Adult Education outcomes have also been increasing.





NEW MEXICO IS RANKED #50 IN ADULT LITERACY



National research indicates a relationship between children and adult reading proficiency. Our recent data analyses for New Mexico counties (PED, Census, and PIAAC data were used) indicates the largest correlation between children's and adults' literacy compared to other socio-economic and educational factors like poverty rate, English non-proficiency, income and college completion.

#### **NEED FOR ADULT EDUCATION**

New Mexico has a great need for all Adult Education services: High school equivalency attainment, English language learning, and adult literacy services. Providing these services not only helps adults attain family-sustaining jobs and continue to college, but also plays **a crucial role** in children's literacy improvement – a goal we all share.



## 3 Legislative Proposals

#### New Mexico Literacy Institute

- Additional \$3m for Adult Education: improve teacher pay, recruit new teachers, serve more New Mexicans
- Additional \$1.5m for Adult Literacy: increase number of programs & family literacy programs, better support existing programs, more access to PD
- \$1.5m for HSE System: Free testing for all; new testing centers, including mobile testing; statewide awareness-raising campaign

- Structured literacy, an approach based on the science of reading
- Services for the youngest New Mexicans – from cradle to career
- Adult and family literacy are integrated into the Institute
- Summer Reading Institute: nearly 10,000 served



## LITERACY PROGRAMS INCREASING

- In 2023, we increased adult literacy programs from 8 to 18
- Connecting small adult literacy programs to each other and to PD

# INTEGRATED EDUCATION & TRAINING (IET)

- An exciting workforce development model for adult learners
- Industry-recognized credentials
- Increases in credentials, programs, and enrollment



- All Adult Education academic and employment performance outcomes increased in last 2 years
- Adult Education ranking changed from #50 (FY20) to #20 (predicted in FY24) in academic outcomes nationally
- · New testing centers opened
- First mobile testing center opened

#### TOTAL TRANSCRIPT

Scores from different publishers can be combined into the credential

## ELIMINATION OF TEST SCORES' EXPIRATION PERIOD

Passed subject scores no longer expire after 3 years

#### ONE AND DONE

Campaign to encourage test takers to take the last remaining HSE exam

## CHANGE IN COOLING OFF TIME

Waiting time between retakes was decreased to the smallest allowed by publishers
