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AN ACT

RELATING TO INDIAN AFFAIRS; MOVING THE INTERTRIBAL CEREMONIAL OFFICE TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION; RENAMING THE INTERTRIBAL CEREMONIAL OFFICE AS THE INTERTRIBAL INDIAN CEREMONIAL ASSOCIATION; AMENDING AND RECOMPILING SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 9-15C-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005, Chapter 219, Section 1, as amended) is recompiled as Section 12-16-1 NMSA 1978 and is amended to read:

"12-16-1. SHORT TITLE.--[Chapter 9, Article 15C] Chapter 12, Article 16 NMSA 1978 may be cited as the "Intertribal Ceremonial Act"."

23	A. The "intertribal <u>Indian</u> ceremonial [office]

2	B. The [governor] county shall appoint a director,						
3	who shall serve at the pleasure of the [governor] county. The						
4	director shall hire and terminate other necessary employees,						
5	who shall be subject to the provisions of the Personnel Act.						
6	C. The director shall:						
7	(1) work with [the department] private, local,						
8	state and federal entities to establish steady funding for the						
9	intertribal ceremonial;						
10	(2) supervise the activities of the [office]						
11	association;						
12	(3) work with the [department] county to						
13	promote the intertribal ceremonial; and						
14	(4) prepare an annual budget and an annual						
15	report on the activities of the [office] association.						
16	D. The [office] association shall:						
17	(l) administer an annual intertribal						
18	ceremonial;						
19	(2) cooperate with and assist public and						
20	private entities that seek to promote recognition of ceremonies						
21	significant to Indian <u>nations</u> , tribes and pueblos;						
22	(3) function as the coordinating [office]						
23	association for all services and activities pertaining to the						
24	intertribal ceremonial;						
25	(4) adopt rules in accordance with the State						

Rules Act to carry out the duties of the [office] association;

- (5) accept gifts, grants, donations, bequests and devises from any source to be used to carry out its duties;
 - (6) enter into contracts; and
- (7) charge admission, parking and concessions fees, give prizes and premiums, create sponsorships and other forms of advertising, arrange entertainments and do all things the [office] association may consider proper for the conduct of the intertribal ceremonial and not otherwise prohibited by law.
- E. The "intertribal ceremonial board" is created. The board shall consist of [eight] nine members, including the director, who shall serve ex officio, [the secretary or the secretary's designated representative and six] and eight members, appointed by the [governor] county, who shall serve terms of five years each [provided that the governor's first appointments shall be made of two board members for one-year terms, two for two-year terms, one for a three-year term and one for a four-year term]. All intertribal ceremonial board members shall be bona fide residents of the [state] county or surrounding counties, and at least a majority of the members shall be Native American. A board member shall not be removed during the term of office except for cause, following notice and an opportunity for a hearing."

SECTION 4. Section 9-15C-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005, Chapter 219, Section 4, as amended) is recompiled as Section .223050.2

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12-16-4 NMSA 1978 and is amended to read:

"12-16-4. INTERTRIBAL CEREMONIAL FUND CREATED--ADMINISTRATION. -- The "intertribal ceremonial fund" is created in the state treasury. Money appropriated to the fund or accruing to it through sales, gifts, grants, fees, penalties, beguests or any other source shall be delivered to the state treasurer and deposited in the fund. Money in the fund is appropriated to the [office] local government division of the department of finance and administration for the purpose of carrying out the intertribal ceremonial. Money in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not revert. Interest and earnings from the fund shall be credited to the fund. Disbursements from the fund shall be made on warrant drawn by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the director or the director's authorized representative."

SECTION 5. TEMPORARY PROVISION--INTERTRIBAL CEREMONIAL BOARD MEMBERSHIP--CURRENT BOARD MEMBERS--APPOINTMENTS.--Current intertribal ceremonial board members appointed by the governor shall serve out the remainder of their terms. Once a board member's term has ended, the governing body of McKinley county shall have the opportunity to appoint another board member to the intertribal ceremonial board.

SECTION 6. TEMPORARY PROVISION--TRANSFER OF FUNCTIONS, PERSONNEL, MONEY, APPROPRIATIONS, PROPERTY, CONTRACTUAL

OBLIGATIONS AND STATUTORY REFERENCES. --

- A. On the effective date of this act, all functions, personnel, money, appropriations, records, furniture, equipment, supplies and other property of the intertribal ceremonial office of the tourism department are transferred to the local government division of the department of finance and administration.
- B. On the effective date of this act, all contractual obligations of the intertribal ceremonial office of the tourism department are binding on local government division of the department of finance and administration.
- C. On the effective date of this act, all references in law to the intertribal ceremonial office of the tourism department shall be deemed to be references to the intertribal Indian ceremonial association of the local government division of the department of finance and administration.
- SECTION 7. TEMPORARY PROVISION--RECOMPILATION

 INSTRUCTIONS.--Section 9-15C-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005,

 Chapter 219, Section 5) is recompiled as Section 12-16-5 NMSA 1978.
- SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION.--Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the local government division of the department of finance and administration for expenditure in fiscal year 2024 to employ a .223050.2

full-time director to manage and oversee the intertribal Indian ceremonial association and for operational expenses of the association. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2024 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2023.

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
