## AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT; CREATING THE LOCAL JOB-CREATION GRANT PROGRAM; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] LOCAL JOB-CREATION GRANT
PROGRAM--CREATED--PURPOSE.--The "local job-creation grant
program" is created in the economic development department.
The purpose of the local job-creation grant program is to
stimulate job creation in New Mexico by targeting money to
local economic development organizations for economic-base jobcreation planning and for job-creation plan implementation.

SECTION 2. [NEW MATERIAL] PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY--POWERS

AND DUTIES--DEFINITION.--

A. An organization whose purpose is to create jobs and promote economic development within a specific locality or .205078.3

region of the state may apply to the economic development department for a grant equal to eighty percent of the cost of participating in the local job-creation grant program. organization that receives such a grant shall, in accordance with any applicable rules established by the economic development department:

- engage in a job-creation planning process in which the organization convenes individuals who, collectively, have expertise in all economic sectors to meet regularly and:
- identify the economic-base job-(a) creation needs of the locality or region that the organization serves;
- (b) measure the economic-base jobcreation potential, by sector, for that locality or region; and

(c) identify and rank the impediments to realizing that economic-base job-creation potential, as classified by the need for: 1) capital investments, savings, loans and other financing mechanisms to support business startup, growth and relocation; 2) utility infrastructure and supply, including internet connectivity; 3) transportation infrastructure and services; 4) real estate, including land and commercial and residential structures; 5) changes to the taxation and regulatory systems; 6) heightened public safety; 7) marketing for businesses to relocate to the locality or

department any portion of a grant award not timely used for engaging in a job-creation planning process as set forth in Paragraph (1) of this subsection.

B. As used in this section, "economic-base job" means a job in which sixty percent or more of the revenue generated from the goods or services produced derives from outside the state.

SECTION 3. [NEW MATERIAL] ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

DEPARTMENT--DUTIES.--In administering the local job-creation grant program, the economic development department shall:

- A. establish an application form and solicit eligible organizations' participation;
- B. review completed applications and select participants based on criteria established by the department;
- C. award grants to each participant in increments based on the participant's performance of its duties as set forth in this act;
- D. monitor and oversee each participant's compliance with its duties as set forth in this act;
- E. provide technical assistance to each participant as needed; and
- F. establish grant award criteria, deadlines and reporting and other rules necessary for that administration.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION.--One hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the .205078.3

economic development department for expenditure in fiscal year 2018 for the local job-creation grant program. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2018 shall revert to the general fund.
