13	GRANTS-MERCEDES PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 49, ARTICLE 1 NMSA 1978.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 49-1-1.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2004,
17	Chapter 124, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"49-1-1.1. DEFINITIONSAs used in Chapter 49 NMSA 1978:
19	A. "child" means a biological, adopted or foster
20	child, a stepchild, a legal ward or a child of a person
21	standing in loco parentis;
22	B. "heir" means a person who is a descendant of the
23	original grantees and has an interest in the common land of a
24	land grant-merced through inheritance, gift or purchase or as
25	defined in the bylaws of a land grant-merced;
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1 C. "land grant-merced" means a grant of land made 2 by the government of Spain or by the government of Mexico to a community, town, colony or pueblo or to a person for the 3 purpose of founding or establishing a community, town, colony 4 or pueblo and includes land partitioned from a land grant-5 merced pursuant to Subsection A of Section 49-1-2 NMSA 1978; 6 7 D. "parent" includes a biological, adoptive or 8 foster parent, a stepparent or an individual who stands in loco 9 parentis to a child; "precinct" means a geographic location such as a 10 Ε. community or town that is guaranteed an apportioned amount of 11 12 positions on the board of trustees of a land grant-merced as 13 defined in the land grant-merced bylaws; "qualified voting member" means an heir who is 14 F. registered to vote in a land grant-merced as prescribed in the 15 land grant-merced bylaws; and 16 "sibling" includes a stepsibling and a half-17 G. sibling." 18 Section 49-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1907, 19 SECTION 2. 20 Chapter 42, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read: "49-1-2. 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1	claims or designated as land grants-mercedes in any report or
2	list of land grants prepared by the surveyor general and
3	confirmed by congress; [ <del>but</del> ] <u>and</u>
4	(2) land partitioned from a land grant-merced;
5	provided that the Guadalupe Hidalgo treaty division of the
6	office of the attorney general has certified that:
7	(a) the partition was made to heirs of
8	the original land grant-merced prior to 2004 for the purpose of
9	establishing common land for a separate community or town;
10	(b) the partitioned land has been
11	managed as common land for the original partition beneficiaries
12	or their heirs for at least twenty years;
13	(c) the boundaries of the partitioned
14	land have been confirmed by deed of title or indenture executed
15	by the board of trustees of the original land grant-merced or
16	by a state or federal court; and
17	(d) the partition has been affirmed by a
18	court of competent jurisdiction.
19	B. Sections 49-1-1 through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978 shall
20	not apply to any land grant that is now managed or controlled
21	in any manner, other than as provided in Sections 49-1-1
22	through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978, by virtue of any general or special
23	act.
24	C. The Guadalupe Hidalgo treaty division of the
25	office of the attorney general shall establish methods and
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procedures for certifying partitions of land grants-mercedes pursuant to Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of this section.

 $[B_{\cdot}]$  D. If a majority of the members of the board 3 of trustees of a land grant-merced covered by specific legislation determines that the specific legislation is no longer beneficial to the land grant-merced, the board has the 7 authority to petition the legislature to repeal the legislation and to be governed by its bylaws and as provided in Sections 8 9 49-1-1 through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978.

[C.] E. The town of Tome land grant-merced, situated in Valencia county, confirmed by congress in 1858 and patented by the United States to the town of Tome, shall be governed by the provisions of Sections 49-1-1 through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978.

[D.] F. The town of Atrisco land grant-merced, situated in Bernalillo county, confirmed by the court of private land claims in 1894 and patented by the United States to the town of Atrisco in 1905, shall be governed by the provisions of Sections 49-1-1 through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978; provided that the board of trustees shall not have regulatory jurisdiction over, and the provisions of Chapter 49, Article 1 NMSA 1978 shall not apply to or govern, any lands or interests in real property the title to which is held by any other person, including a public or private corporation, partnership or limited liability company.

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[E.] G. The Tecolote land grant-merced, also known as the town of Tecolote, situated in San Miguel county, confirmed by congress in 1858 and patented by the United States to the town of Tecolote in 1902, shall be governed by the provisions of Sections 49-1-1 through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978.
[F.] H. Notwithstanding the provisions of

Subsection A <u>of this section</u> to the contrary, the San Antonio del Rio Colorado land grant-merced, situated in Taos county, which claim was recommended for confirmation by surveyor general James K. Proudfit in 1874 and again in 1886 by surveyor general George W. Julian, but not confirmed by congress, shall be governed by the provisions of Sections 49-1-1 through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978.

[G.] I. The Manzano land grant-merced, also known as la merced del Manzano land grant-merced, situated in Torrance county, confirmed by congress in 1860 and patented by the United States to the town of Manzano in 1907, shall be governed by the provisions of Chapter 49, Article 1 NMSA 1978."

SECTION 3. TEMPORARY PROVISION.--Nothing in this act shall be construed to alter or diminish the legal status of an existing land grant-merced or any rights established under the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo.

**SECTION 4.** EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2023.

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
