


History

- The South Central Colfax County Special Hospital District was formed in 1986 with the help of Presbyterian Healthcare Services of Albuquerque. There was a critical need to expand health care services in this region of Colfax County.
- Springer was served by two physicians and a small general acute hospital that also had 10 nursing home beds.
- Angel Fire had one physician that visited from Raton on a monthly basis. Patients were traveling in excess of 60 miles for a simple doctor's visit.
- Cimarron did not have a medical provider.

Formation

The hospital district was formed using the school district boundaries for Maxwell School District, Springer School District and Cimarron School District. This is an area of approximately 2,800 square miles and has a population of 3,200. The terrain goes from rangeland to mountains.




Locations

- Since its inception, the hospital district has been able to expand health care services to all the communities within its service area through Colfax General Long Term Care, Colfax General Laboratory, Moreno Valley Health Care Clinic, and Cimarron Healthcare Clinic.
- The hospital district is now a self managed organization with no management affiliation.
- Patient satisfaction is in the high ninety's and the Mill Levy was approved last year with a 92% positive vote.

Governing Board


- The board is comprised of 5 members elected by popular vote and representative of each school district.

- Louise Lewis, is also a Certified Family Nurse Practitioner and works Wednesday and Friday.
- We have a Clinic Practice Manager that is an RN with her BSN who oversees all clinical operations working with our Medical Director, Dr. Cohen. We also have a Practice Manager that oversees all the business office operations for both clinic.
- We have two certified Medical Assistants and two billing clerks.

Cimarron Healthcare Clinic

- Eddie Baldwin is a Physician Assistant, he sees patients on Monday and Tuesday each week and makes as needed house calls during the week.
- Dr. Abbie Laursen is a board certified Internal Medicine Physician who works Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and also makes house calls as needed.
- Marie Richards is an EMT I and certified Medical Assistant. She handles all billing functions and patient admissions.
- The clinic is managed through the Moreno Valley Healthcare Clinic which provides administration and clinical guidance.

- In addition to routine primary care, the clinics provides the following services:
 - Free blood pressure screenings
 - Breast and Cervical screening
 - Osteoporosis screening
 - Flu shots
 - Well woman Exams
 - Well child exams
 - Safe sex information
 - Immunizations

 - Senior programs
 - Health fairs

Clinic Utilization


Both Clinics are seeing the majority of patients in the region.


There will always be patients that require services we cannot provide, however we do work with the specialists to ensure the patients get the care they need.


We work with health fairs in both Cimarron and Angel Fire and work closely with both EMS agencies.





















Cimarron Volunteer Ambulance

Cimarron Volunteer Ambulance

- In the fall of 1979 a small group of people from Cimarron and Springer interested in becoming EMT's came together to hopefully provide emergency care for the communities.
- Springer had a private ambulance that was connected with the funeral home in Springer. They provided emergency care and transportation for Springer and Cimarron along with the area ranches and recreational areas.
- A grant was awarded to purchase equipment that was originally placed in the back of EMT's vehicles so they could respond to the scene, it later was placed in a 1968 VW Station Wagon that became known as the first Emergency Response Vehicle for Cimarron.

Cimarron Volunteer Ambulance

The all volunteer service runs 24/7.

The service operates with three ambulances.

It has two paramedics, four EMT intermediates, ten EMT basics and one first responder.

They cover over 1,100 square miles and have run over 120 runs so far this year.



