- Membership has grown by 62% overall since the inception of Centennial Care to current
- UHC retained a considerable number of members receiving Long-Term Care services
- Significant enrollment of Expansion and Medicaid (previously Salud!) members since the beginning of the program
- Out of the current active enrollment (80775 members), 10427 unique members have received behavioral health services since the beginning of 2015.

Value to Our Communities:

- ✓ **Care coordination staff** – Nearly 50% of UHC’s care coordinators statewide are experienced behavioral health professionals.
- ✓ **Transportation to Pharmacy Value-Added Benefit** – All UHC members are able to receive transportation services to their local pharmacies in addition to standard transportation for routine medically necessary services.
- ✓ **Community Training & Education** – The UHC Peer Support Team has completed the following trainings to over 400 community members statewide:
 - **Mental Health First Aid** is a public education program that introduces participants to risk factors and warning signs of mental illnesses, builds understanding of their impact, and overviews common supports. These trainings have been presented both in English and Spanish.
 - **Suicide Prevention Training: QPR (Question, Persuade & Refer)** – training on how to approach a person in a crisis who may be contemplating suicide.
 - **My Chronic Disease (MyCD)** – is a structured program to learn how to explore healthy ways to live with chronic conditions by overcoming the physical, mental, and emotional problems with the goal to achieve and enjoy quality of life.
