



## **Assisted Out Patient Treatment**

- Applied for grant in June.
- Grant would be used to establish infrastructure for a comprehensive system of care for behavior health consumers.
- Grant valued at \$4 million
- Award notification in September 2016
- Implementation in October 2016

## **Assisted Out Patient Treatment**

Project will bring together:

- City of Albuquerque
- Bernalillo County
- University of New Mexico Hospital
- Mental healthcare providers
- The Judicial District Court system
- Law enforcement
- Corrections facilities
- Community-based service agencies

## **Assisted Out Patient Treatment**

If awarded, the grant will accelerate the formation of infrastructure to ultimately reduce:

- Incidence and duration of psychiatric hospitalization
- Homelessness
- Incarcerations
- Interactions with the criminal justice system

While improving the health and social outcomes of individuals with serious mental illness.

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AOT Consumers would receive a comprehensive screening that includes:

- Comprehensive psychiatric evaluation
- Medical screening examination
- Social history for recommendations to the courts
- Data input for outcome evaluation
- Development of initial treatment plan with consumers input
- Access to a range of treatment services
- Continue to live in the community
- Assigned to a community support worker

## **Assisted Out Patient Treatment**

Grant projections:

- Year one – 60 eligible
- After four years – 120 individuals served
- 25% projected annual increase
- 345 total individuals served throughout the life of the grant
