

#### Accreditation of GME

- Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical (ACGME) Education or American Osteopathic Association (AOA) accredits residencies separately until 2020 after which all residencies will be accredited by the ACGME
  - In NM: 53 UNM programs + 2 stand alone family medicine programs (Hildago Medical Center in Silver City and Memorial Hospital in Las Cruces)
  - 2 more program seeking accreditation (Plastic surgery and Clinical Informatics)
- Accreditation of Institution, Program, and Hospital learning environment



- 1965-1984 teaching hospitals/physicians billed more per service to pay for residency positions
- 1984 Medicare Prospective Payment System
  - Set payment for services
  - DME paid to hospitals for residency salary and faculty time
  - IME paid to hospitals for decreased efficiency of sicker patients
  - Single payer system established




- 1997-2011 Balanced Budget Act
  - Limited the number of residency positions Medicare funded
- 2011-present Institutions seek alternative funding
  - Affordable Care Act Federally qualified teaching centers
  - State funded positions
  - Medicaid cost sharing

## **UNM Residency Funding**

Funding Source	Number of residency positions
University Hospital	413
Veterans' Affairs	~100
Other Hospitals	24
Individual UNM School of Medicine Departments	63
State Funding	18

We will be returning during the 2016 legislative session to request the next 9 GME State Funded Positions



- Increased exposure to underserved populations
  - Rural
  - Homeless
- Psychiatrists in Primary Care Settings
- Increased exposure to non-hospital based primary care
- Increased number of residents accepted into Primary Care





### Conclusion

- GME is a complex enterprise incapable of rapid expansion
- State funded GME positions allow for greater exposure to under-represented and underserved populations throughout NM
