BCOM is focused on increasing diversity in the physician workforce and fostering a practice of life-long learning, compassion, respect and excellence in its students.

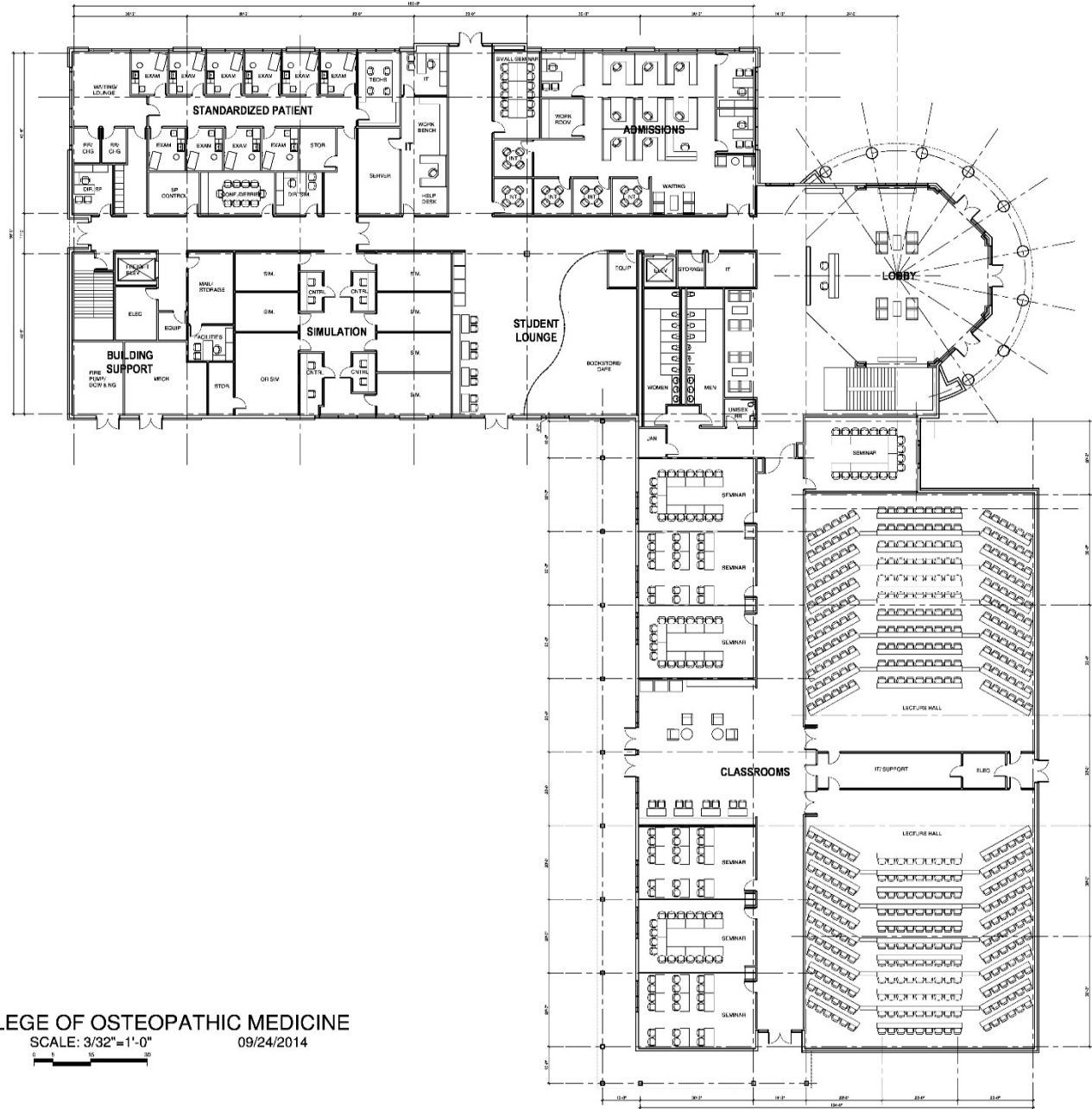

 FIRST FLOOR SCALE: 3/32"=1'-0" 09/24/2014

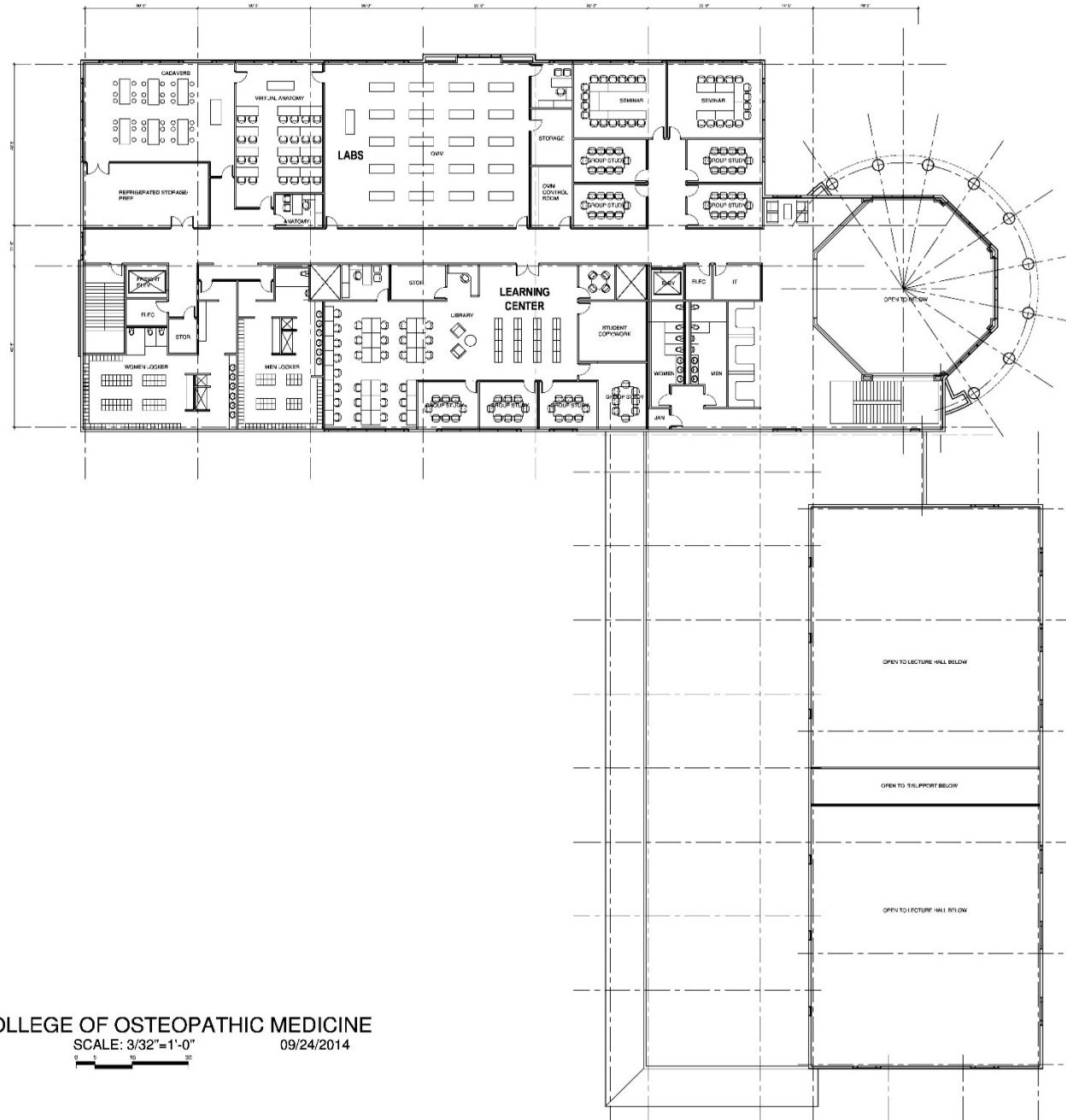

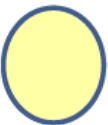

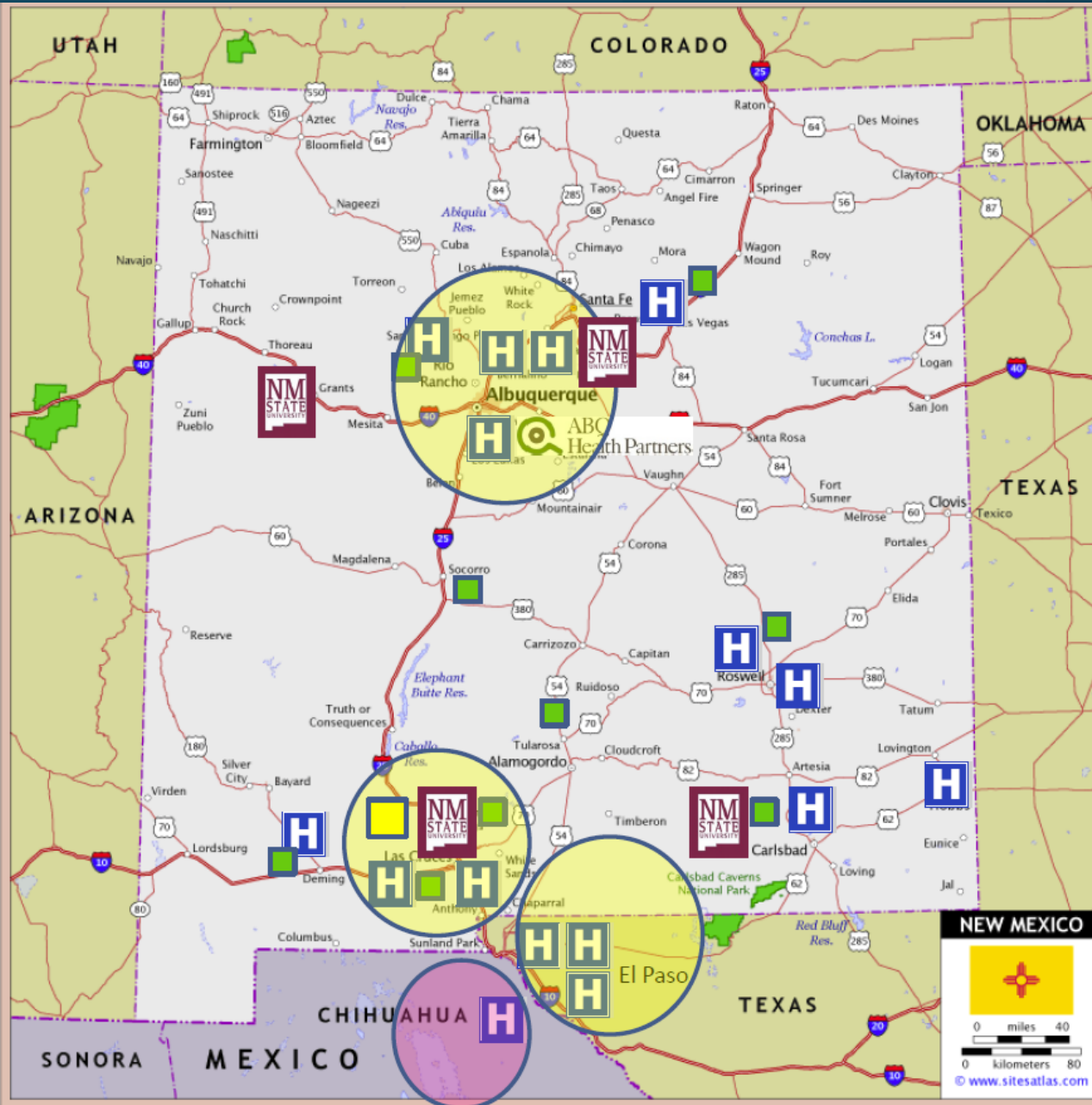

CHAPTER 7
PART 4 – PRIMARY CARE PHYSICIAN STUDENT LOAN-FOR-SERVICE
PROGRAM**

Purpose of 5.7.4 NMAC is to increase the number of primary care physicians in underserved areas of the state, by making educational loans to medical students seeking to become primary care physicians. A condition of the loan, that the student declare their intent to practice as a primary care physician within one of the counties of the state designated by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services as having a shortage of primary care physicians.

In section 5.7.4.8 – Student Eligibility, a student must be accepted by the “university” to be considered for the Loan-For-Service program. In section 5.7.4.7 (N) - Definitions- “University” means the University of New Mexico School of Medicine.
