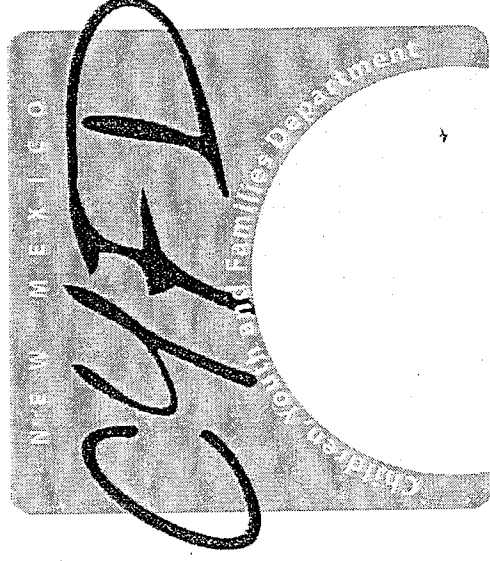
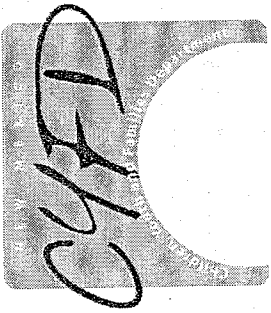

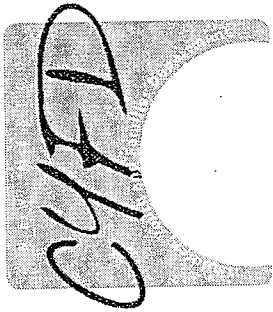

## Early Childhood Investment Zones

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- Data-based Collaborative Effort Between
  - Children, Youth and Families Department
  - Department of Health
  - Public Education Department
- Research-based
  - Quality early childhood services have the greatest impact on children who have greatest need
- Consolidate Limited Resources

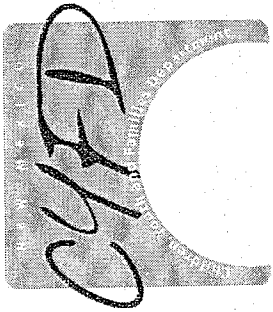

Percentage on free and reduced meals

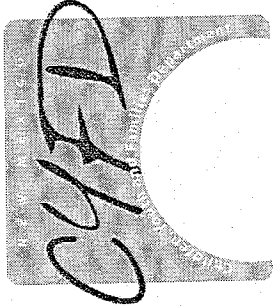
Percentage 25 and over who have not graduated from HS

## Continuum of Early Learning (Pre-Kindergarten) Programs

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- Home Visiting - Pre-natal to Kindergarten Entry
- Early Head Start - Pre-natal to Age Three
- FIT/Early Intervention - Birth to Age Three
- Child Care – Six Weeks to Age Thirteen
- Head Start – Age Three to Kindergarten Entry
- New Mexico PreK – Age 4 to Kindergarten Entry
- Early Childhood Special Education – Age Three to Kindergarten Entry

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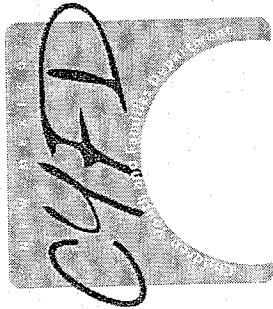
- **State and Federal Funding**

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- \$900,000 FY12 Allocation — targeted services in Early Childhood Investment Zones
  - Expanded services/New sites
  - Established third Intensive Home Visiting site in Judicial District #6
    - (Luna, Grant & Hidalgo)
  - Professional Development
