What did Colorado do?


- Between 2008 and 2015 Anonymous Donor invested in CDPHE family planning program.
- Called it "Colorado Family Planning Initiative"
 - Directed funds toward Title X clinics
 - Statewide within existing Title X network
 - \$ for devices provided over 40,000 LARCs to low-income women
 - Identified "champions" in the field
 - Trained providers, built confidence
 - Invested in clinic business structures
 - Watched data researched and published
 - Partnered with media outlets
 - Normalized the work



Primary Goal


Access to <u>all FDA-approved</u> contraceptives, with emphasis on LARC for women who choose it.

Reduced Cost



Not "free", but on a sliding fee scale.

LARC in Tier One Methods, but not the only choice




Patient-Centered counseling.

Motivational Interviewing.


One-Key Question.

Made being "not pregnant" the default.


- •No daily pill to take to make you not pregnant.

- •Intentional action to get pregnant.




Put all these elements together



Increase in use of LARCs




The Results in Colorado (2008-2014)






CFPI's Impact

Total Number of Births and Fertility Rates Ages 15-19, Colorado, 2007-2014







U.S. and Colorado




High Risk Births

Analysis of costs avoided

4 entitlement programs

- Medicaid
- TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families)
- SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)
- WIC (Women, Infant, Children)
- 3 non-entitlement programs
 - Colorado Child Care Assistance Program
 - Colorado Preschool Program
 - Colorado Housing Choice Voucher Program



MEDICAID costs avoided

MEDICAIN

Prenatal care, labor and delivery, immediate postpartum care

- \$5,618 to \$6,679 annually
- Infant medical costs through age 4
 - \$2,565 to \$4,134 annually



2,583 to 3,324 births averted

Total costs avoided = \$52 million-\$54 million

Costs avoided, Other Entitlement Programs

- Temporary Assistance to Needy Families
 - \$6-7 million
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
 - \$5-6 million
- Women Infant and Children (WIC)
 - \$3 million



(five years, ages 15-24 only)



Costs potentially avoided

- Colorado Child Care Assistance Program
 - \$1.7-\$2.1 million
- Colorado Preschool Program
 - \$0.7-\$1.1 million
- Colorado Housing Choice Voucher Program
 - \$71,000 to \$86,000
- Programs had waiting lists, so savings were not realized

(five years, ages 15-24 only)



Total costs avoided, ages 15-24

Entitlement	2010 to 2014
Medicaid	\$52 million- \$54 million
TANF	\$6-\$7 million
SNAP	\$5 million
WIC	\$3 million
Total	\$66 million - \$70 million



What's Next?

- Training providers outside of the Title X network (SBHC, FQHC, pediatricians)
- Continue to track data "Women's Health Report Card"
- STI analysis as it relates to LARC
- Disseminate research and data results
- "Hold the Line" on past success, yet plan for LARC 2.0
