### NM Ready Grant Fiber Optic Termination


The courses include

- Certified Fiber Optics Specialist in Splicing (CFOS/S)
- Certified Fiber Optics Outside Plant Specialist (CFOS/O)

These four certifications prepare students for any fiber optic positions requiring premise installation, outside installation, splicing or testing.
